pp.1 and 3: it is not always clear to me what "building" is being referred to.

See pencil marks.

P.5 on H 6 : 9 lower filling. On SS 3221, "VG has placed it in the late 4th or early 3rd c." Cannot remember what this comes from. I see in a marginal note on my Deposit List of H 6 : 9 I have written "early 3rd". But there are no real parallels with useful context, different dies are listed together, necessarily for the published ones which are not illustrated. Don't call the stamp "square" but "rectangular" - there is a practically square die, but SS 3221 does not come from it. I (p.48) would mention in the description the remarkable hardness of the clay of this handle.

P.7 on relation between Koroni and Group A (G 13 : 4) and Group B (H 16 : 3). You state here that the Koroni pottery "resembled that in Thompson's Groups A and B" - that is, in fact, how they put it on their ~~page~~ p.59. They then remark that "the greater number" resemble objects from the former group. In fact, in their catalogue in the same article, they cite only ONE parallel in Group B, and that is to no. 42, an unguentarium. I think I would not say (i.e. as from yourself) that Koroni pottery resembles that of Group B, unless of course you believe it ? ? Do you not accept, as HAT does now, a date of about 240 BC for the end date of Group B? (Cf. Ath.Mitt. 1974, p.198, note 19.)

P.7 on E 3 : 1, "VG places the amphora handles between Thompson's Groups A and B." There are no "stamped amphora handles" in this deposit except 2 that are incorporated in whole jars, SS 6127 and SS 6128. The date I suggested was based on a comparison of SS 6127, i.e. the shape of the jar, with P 1113 from Group B, which seems to be rather later in the same series, so SS 6127 should be rather before Group B, or rather before about 240 B.C. See EAD 27, pp.365-6 on jars of this kind (the Nikandros Group, production center not known), with mention of some of these items cited here. Now a stamp similar to that of SS 6127 has ^{turned} ~~turned~~ up in a deposit in Samos in which the SAM seem to me to be nearly all datable in 270-240 B.C. However the Samos excavators put their deposit a good deal later because of an inscription also in it.

p. 8, on O 18 : 2 (Hedgehog Well). Amphora material published from this well, see Blanckenhagen volume (1979), p. 126 under no. 2, on SS 8210, which is matched by a duplicate from a ^(P 13570) suitable level in J 5 : 1 (SS 14771). A Thasian amphora, with a ^{that names} stamp of NIKIAZ comes from the same well, see Hesp. Suppl.X, pl.60, nos. 4 and 4a, and see text, p.135, under no. 45.

Pp. 9, 15, elsewhere? -"heavily sorted" seems to me not clear English. You don't mean "sorted" but the horrible practice that follows the sorting, of throwing away a lot of material that our predecessors thought it was not necessary for us to see, once they had saved us one of each noticed kind. Shd it be "weeded" ? or "selected" ? (I don't deny that there was and is a terrible shortage of storage space.) But somehow the discarding should be done by the person responsible for publication.)

P. 17: for "feels", say "thinks" or "believes"

Note 63 from pl. 17. ". . long-petal bowls which were introduced in Athens in the 140's" Note 63 which documents this I find not very convincing, so I wonder

if actually you are thoroughly convinced. It might be better not to be too dogmatic, at least and leave yourself room to reconsider. At present I am noticing that in several of those deposits in which long-petals are associated with other material apparently of the 1/2 of the 2nd, the Knidian indicate a date close to the beginning of the period of phourarchoi, i.e. I would say still in the first quarter of the 2nd. Thus the Peiraeus cistern, also E 15 : 4; E¹⁶ : 1 and 2 are mostly like that, although there is the one later Knidian. So I would suggest a vogue for long-petals around 180 or a little earlier, and then again in the 2/2 of the century.

Pp. 20, 21, on Group C (G 6 : 2) I think if you are pulling the date from 200 to the 2/4 of the 2nd, you should not describe your preferred date as "slightly later" than ca. 200 B.C. For the stamps, those in F 5 : 1 and G 5 : 3 (SS 282) do have parallels with each other, but the single item in Group C is far earlier - like the coin, it is probably some years earlier than 200. Your pottery of course may be later, despite coin and stamp.

Pp. 25-26, on E 6 : 1 and 2 (Egyptian cistern). (Abandonment). The para on pp. 25-26, I don't find very clear and convincing. Probably there shd be a specific reference for the plates you mean in Group E, perhaps also some documentation for 125 BC for bowls ~~with~~ whose inner walls are offset from the floor (or is that obvious if one reads the whole text). Should you say either 140 or 150 consistently for when you believe long-petals came in. I don't really understand the last sentence. I observe again the presence of long-petals in company with stamps datable at the beginning of my period IV (SS 6501, 6507, 6510, 6513).

P.26, supplemental fill of E 6 : 1 or 2. Here and in note 87, slight confusion of reference - there is only one whole amphora. I have pencilled in some corrections, and attach here the SS cards.

Information on SAH requested for S. Retroff's dissertation

C 10 : 1. The latest SAH, both Knidian, are SS 4864, with a duoviri stamp of the year of the eponym ΣΤΡΑΤΟΚΛΗΣ; and SS 6613, which names the eponym ΔΑΜΟ- (jam) ΚΡΙΤΟΣ. These two eponyms of the duoviri period are among those named in circular bullshead types of the potter ΔΑΜΟΚΡΑΤΗΣ, and not in those of the succeeding potter ΔΙΟΣΚΟΥΡΙΑΔΑΣ who took over the bullshead types after ΔΑΜΟΚΡΑΤΗΣ. So they are apparently datable in the decade preceding ca. 97 B.C.. On these two potters, see Delos 27, p. 321; on the two eponyms, see the index of the same volume; on the duoviri period in general, see ibid., pp. 320-323.

D.11 : 3. The Knidian eponym ΕΡΜΟΦΑΝΤΟΣ is apparently the latest in the deposit. He directly dates SS 4920, and indirectly (it is the duoviri type from the other handle of the jar) probably dates SS 4919. In Delos 27, under E 98, I suggested a date just after a break in stamping Knidian amphoras, a break probably of 88 to ca. 85 B.C., see ibid., p. 322. But it now seems possible that the term of ΕΡΜΟΦΑΝΤΟΣ fell just before the break, i.e. perhaps 88 B.C. In that case, maybe none of the eponyms in D 11 : 3 is actually post-Sullan, though several must be close to 88 B.C.

E 14 : 1, lower fill (not lowest). The latest SAH are SS 4266 and 4268, joining pair of Knidian, datable close to 150 B.C. But these are isolated and different from the main group, and seem to have been found on top of the fill..

Apart from the above two, the latest may be SS 4173, Rhodian neck with both handles, from a jar of ΧΡΗΣΙΜΟΣ dated in the term of ΖΙΜΥΛΙΝΟΣ, which may have fallen in about 218 B.C., but this term is still under study. Next earlier than that would probably be SS 4269, from a jar of ΕΡΜΙΦΟΝΟΣ in the term of ΕΥΣΡ(ΑΝΣΡ), perhaps of 223 B.C.

F 17 : 4. The latest eponym is perhaps ΑΣΤΥΜΗ(ΔΗ) (the earliest of three of this name, see Delos 27, under E 15, for the first and second, and ibid. p. 299 with note 3 for the third). The Astymedes named on SS 14658 of this deposit is to be dated probably near ²¹⁴ 218 B.C.

G 14 : 2. The eponym of SS 326 is ΠΑΝΑΠΟΜΕΝΗΣ, believed to date shortly before 88 B.C. The eponym of SS 9464 is probably to be restored [EY]ΒΟΥΛΟΣ, and to be dated soon after the break in Knidian stamping of ~~ΒΟΥΛΟΣ~~ 88 - ca.85 B.C. The eponym of SS 9465 is also ΑΛΕΞΑΝΑΡΟΣ, of the duoviri period (named by ΔΑΜΟΚΡΑΤΗΣ, hence of the first half of the period, see above under C 10 : 1).

To S. Retroff I had said (19.III.74), look at my long analysis in the Deposits Summaries, headed "mostly 3/4 of ~~the~~ 2nd B.C." Included are two later Knidian stamps: SS 9193, dated in the term of ^{ΣΣΣΙΩΡΕΝ} ~~ΣΣΣΙΩΡΕΝ~~, close to 108 B.C. (cf. Delos 27, p. 332, under E 38); and SS 10170, dated in the term of ANAPOMENHΣ, close to ^E 88 B.C. (ibid., pp. 346-7, under ~~xxx~~ 166). The relative position of ANAPOMENHΣ close to the destruction on Delos by Mithradates in 88, and of Athens by Sulla in 86, is shown by the grid of fabricant - eponym name-connections referred to, ibid. p. 321. SS 10170 brings the latest part of the deposit down to about 90 B.C., unless one discards SS 10170 from the group.

Apart from the two, SS 9193 and 10170, the SAH from this deposit are third quarter of 2nd century (probably the majority of the Knidian), and earlier, including about 50 Rhodian of the ^{second half of the} 3rd century and Thasian of the 3rd and ^(a few) 4th centuries.

EIM's statement is about what I would say. The presence of earlier material in the same deposit does not of course affect the post-100 date of SS 10170. F. Kleiner's 7 bronze coins "deposited ca. 120" go pretty well with the latest ~~group~~ ^{group} sizable group of Knidian, probably ca. 3/4 of 2nd. As context for other-wise ~~un~~ unplaced SAH in this deposit, I think of it as dating mostly ^{down} to the 3/4 of the 2nd century.

To S. Rotroff I said (19.III.74), "See Delos 27", i.e. look up the deposit in the index (p.381) and the page references there cited. I also said to S.R., "to early second quarter" of 1st B.C. This was a somewhat loose remark such as one makes to give oneself room. There are in the deposit two Knidian stamps (SS 3196 and 3199) which belong apparently to the period when duoviri were named in them, but after a break in production which seems to be datable 88-85 B.C. We can account for about 7 terms in this period, so we guess that they were all within the period 85-78 B.C. On all this, see Delos 27, p. 322. Further reference to the deposit M 23 : 1, see B.C.H. Suppl. I, p. 194, with note 15, and the Pamphylian neck in it is catalogued ibid., p.205, under 12.

I think I would now describe the material that I know in this deposit as ~~datable~~ datable post-Sullan, perhaps still in the first quarter of the ~~xxx~~ 1st century B.C.
