Works on National Museum Collection  
GENERAL

The washing and sorting of the main collection, including the alphabetical sorting of the greater part of the Rhodian, was largely done in the early summer of 1949 by two museum guards and Andreas Dimoulios. See <sup>(yellow)</sup> journal, of which the first entry is 17. March. 49; also <sup>first</sup> tabloid account, photographs attached & inside of folder and given captions. The <sup>end of this</sup> work dragged out because Andreas was called into the army. Andreas' work included a tally of the assortment of this large collection, and another of 326 handles found by Mitsos at the Olympieion; these latter have remained apart, and have not been entered into one Rhodian index yet. Nilsson's <sup>(for Lindsos catalogue)</sup> name-numbers were written on the handles at that time, and those with names not in the Lindsos catalogue were put in a separate heap.

During the later summer of 1949, and into the autumn as she had a free morning from her teaching, XH made carding cards for the Rhodian, using spirit 3x5's cut in half. These cards were used over and over as type cards for the collection, additional examples tacked on the first card. See tabulated new examples of old types into the Agora index, and prepared new types for Miss Koch and checked and filed the new index cards. (See assembled papers on Rhodian at E.M.) (over)

It must have been during our Christmas holidays  
December 1949 - Jan. 1950 that we made a start on the Kurdian, taking  
 readings on half cards of handles from the pile of available  
 stamps, better samples - not a very large number  
 worked on. There seems to be no record at all of this  
 work, but I seem to remember hoping that this selected pile  
 of Kada might help us restore a lot of difficult O stamps  
 at the Agora. A small <sup>mess</sup> of handles still remains in the  
 "office" of the Epigr. Mus. from that period, & there are some half-cards citing examples (now lost). It must  
 have been at the same time that I did a little work on the  
 Thracian, but these were afterwards taken over by Mr. Boa.

In the late summer of 1950, for about ten days (morning)  
 and afternoon September, XIT and ~~X~~ XA wrote numbers on  
 the Rhodian, i.e. added EM numbers to the Nilsson numbers on  
 them ("N. 14 EM 3" etc.) (which is EM 3 of N. 14). They noted  
 that not so ~~as~~ had disappeared. (See assembled E.M. Rhodian papers.)

During this numbering operation, the gates being open  
 into the inner court with the figures, when there were two apostles,  
 those two discovered the second board of handles, and  
 showed them to me, on 1. IX. 50 - the additional 3-4000.  
 See note of the day.

\* (II.62) A note on date - calendar 1) 2. 22, 18, 50 states (3. x. 52) 3.03  
that on that day I demonstrated photography to Mr. Boris (and Mrs.  
ghali) at the Karamikos, and that Mr. Boris took several <sup>lenses</sup>.  
Mr. - Mrs. Boris arrived in Athens in middle of Sept., were  
away (trip to Thassos & pent.) 23. Sept. to ca. 13. Oct., and Mr. Boris  
had already left 9. Nov. when Mr. and I went to Delos. So it  
must have been in September or October 1950 that they made  
readings and photographs of the Thasian in the Nafplio -  
probably before going to Thassos. To try out the new  
camera and hope some <sup>test</sup> film developed before setting out on  
the bigger job. Sept. 19 when the Rhodin numbers were finished  
was perhaps when I saw Mr. Boris <sup>(\*)</sup> photographing.

On or before Dec. 13, 1950, Mr. Boris had the handles  
in the inner apothekia counted; and she <sup>sorted out and</sup> made readings of  
the Thasian, which must have been photographed in the  
summer after ~~about~~ Mr. Boris's return. As the management  
still held to the fact that these handles must not be  
mixed with the others, nor the different sections of their bins  
mixed with each other (in case some record turned up  
of what had been put into the various sections (marked  
A, B, C etc.)), she had them all put back again,  
including, presumably, the Thasian, after photography.

(on one occasion Thursday morning when she was free)  
In April 1951, M.E. read numbers and tabulated the  
double handles, <sup>from a original file</sup> (to help toward a publication of the Auga handles).  
After that, Delos used all our bins for a long period.

Some time in 1951 (?) the handles from the <sup>3</sup>Aratiaduky <sup>3</sup>Ano.  
 big key tips <sup>2</sup>sukas were moved out, because the apothecary  
 was to be pulled down, which has since been done. The handles  
 were moved into <sup>large</sup> cases in a temporary store in the new  
 lower region of the museum, part of a basement room which was  
 then <sup>(board room)</sup> ~~used~~ kept out visitors, especially the workers  
 working on the new parts of the museum. This move was  
 known to me till it was a fait accompli. No further distinction  
 between the various sections of the bins.

4. x. 52

Procession of minor was being finally off (Delos report,  
 epigraphic list, section of Boulters article) with the departure of Henry  
 Robinson with the Boulters as the end of August, <sup>since early in</sup>  
Sept. 1952, began to arrange for work in National Museum<sup>1)</sup> to  
 clear up the Pheidon handles rolling in the dust, cutting the  
 alleys of the Epigraphical museum, being moved here and  
 there when space was needed — for 3 years, and 2.) to get  
 at the Kridan, preferably together with the Kridan from the  
 minor court. <sup>(both corpus).</sup> Part of the Pheidon handles had been put in a  
 separate series for photographs & to later, but this has now  
 been time for this, or money for the enlargements at this point  
 (when Kridan and Thrajan have priority) especially as I ought  
 to make a study of the handles before the selection for photographs,  
 Pheidon coming in so many variations.

actually in July and August 1952 some preliminary figuring and discussions, occasional partly by a need to consult some particular boulders for the Gleadow sponges list. See entries dated 24. VII. 52 etc., on STORAGE. It appears to me not absolutely excluded that the museum could find money for the necessary drawer-storage (see record of talk w. Dennis) on the other hand, even if I found the money outside, a place for the cabinet was not absolutely assured. Feeling of resistance and not very complete frankness. Partly failure of poetry on my part, partly to least and everyone being tired.

On a suggestion of H.A.T., I wrote ~~first~~ to the Philosophical Society asking for forms to apply for a grant of \$1000 for the "cabinets," and finally had an answer. (by surface mail). In the meanwhile the need for a place to put away the recorded boulders was such that I did not feel we should wait till the middle of winter for a possible favorable answer when the season for this job was now (weather, help, as well as need). So with H.A.T.'s permission, I had Receipts: see Master John make a 4-column section with 72 drawers, papers under and paid for it, a little over 2,000,000 dr. for material plus work. ~~the cost~~, or most of it, to be returned to me out of the Philos. grant if obtained. This section was ready at the beginning of September.

although we still had no assurance of a place for the cabinet, we started work when the drawers were ready.

I saw 3 min. on Sept. 4, and M.2 and A. Dim. began the next day to find, wash, <sup>remember if necessary</sup>, and put away the Pheidoli in alphabetical order, according to the readings on the half-cards. This order is mostly by Wilson numbers, but the names not in the Lindroth catalogue are interpolated in their alphabetical positions; note that these have as yet no numbers. Spec. was left in the drawers for the few handles not found; some of these were later found. The drawers were piled in the epigraphical "office", the frame being not yet set up. I spent seven or eight mornings of 4-5 hours each, ~~the~~ during Sept. 10-16, trying about finished in recorded Pheidoli. On Sept. 17 or 18 I called, and found the traps "now 52% LaBa'Gor-tai 23 Koda". For about four more mornings between Sept. 18-26 they both tried to work on these difficult handles, but it became clear that M.2 was not appreciably helped by A. Dep., and he worked at the Agora instead <sup>(on Koda Kaproobacets)</sup> until he went home to study for his ~~no~~ exams, 27. IX.

No space had been left for the extra addition & the alpha series; a new <sup>(temporary)</sup> series will be made, and all put into one later - probably when we have sorted out also those from the various apostles.

at a sign for Sunni, I telephoned and made an appointment, and saw her again at 9:30 2 Oct.

It was arranged that the dinner now in existence be set up in the place tentatively suggested before, with assurance that there would be space there for the ultimate large cabinet, and that we should take out the second set of handles (ΑΑΣΕΚΙΝΑ) from behind the board fence (which had to be breached by the carpenter for us to get in) when they had been dumped when the apothecary was torn down. This is the room in the other half of which the cabinet are to be set up. There were 4 large cases of handles, and another large case which has handles mixed with other things.

επιποτήσιος</sup> On 3 Oct four of us went to the museum, M.S., And. And., Spir. Spir., and I. Mr. Yalouris set things going. After some further discussion, we decided to dump the handles next to the tap in the court of the ευκίνη. After washing they would be piled by bricks on 5' rows at one side of this court. From these piles (they will be red), and set in order by their readings, perhaps along the walls of an unfinished apothecary room next to their ultimate storage place. The 2 boys got out all the handles, except those in the mixed case, in a couple of hours.

The sorting done so far suggested to me a small proportion of Rhodian; but she didn't see the original sorting of the big heap; it may be about the same.

M.S. keeps an eye on these proceedings, and continues,

go through the difficult *Blodias*, being urgent need to waste too much time on them. Today Andr. Andr. was to wash, Mr. Benachi to do some sorting.

(A. returns from N.M. and found, says he washed today 2 large *gambelia* full of bundles. This would be between 8:30 and 12:30. Mr. Benachi came.)

These bundles are all to be marked A A E, in addition to their proper numbers, & distinguish them as having come from the *Aravodiki* *Antalyky* *Tys* *Eukias*.

6. 8. 52 Took a taxi at 9:20 with master John and Spir-Spir. to go to the museum and set up the ready section. Took less than an hour & set it up. We put in the <sup>ready</sup> *Blodia* drawers, leaving an empty drawer after every four full, for expansion. Put in the first bottom drawer part of the unread, which will be labeled in as many of these as required.  
A. Andr. also.

Mr. Benachi was there, very pleasant for a call or name. Stathatos, and read some *Blodian*, writing N. numbers in pencil. We said goodbye.

23.X.52 Ten majority of weekday mornings since then, ME has worked in the museum, processing Slus has now read the new lot of Rhodion from the avardzky grado tyg rys sukas, using the full Rhodian file for 3 days, through yesterday, for the difficult ones. Andrus Andruska has been there for many mornings, has washed all the lot got out 3.X., and numbered the <sup>new</sup> Rhodian with ME's numbers for reading them, and laid them out in order, in preparation for supplementing them into the drawers.

Then, yesterday afternoon I removed & noted that there were more bands noticed, in a mixed case with other objects; not all got out 3.X. ~~treasured~~ ~~and~~ ~~but~~ ~~to~~ ~~sort~~ These must be washed, <sup>and</sup> the Rhodian entered into the series before the drawers are return. ~~answ~~

I went to the N.M. Got them & took out all from the temporary storage place, including content of 2 small cases which had been left before. Remains possibility that there are bundles below the lowweight etc in some large cases. From a case containing mostly other fragments, took out a Rhodian day stamp w. well pres. incis.; after that decided to have single bundles with mixed lots in case they bear some significance (from only 1 other).

Saw Mr. Tolovis, who goes next week to Olympia. The floor of the partly built apothecary is to be fully cleared for us & spread the Rhodian; part of the area is not plowed, stands lower, and full of water when it rains: This will be lost to us, so we will need extra space

in the inner room, where the first unit of the cabinet is.

In the latter room, the light from the doorway will do for photography, especially, after ten hours have fallen from the fig-tree, and we get bright reflection from the walls behind.

A.A. still has some of these last - found handle to wash; ME <sup>Pushkin</sup> the Pushkin of them to wash. A couple of piles of unsorted washes are still to be brought from the court of the chief museum.

27.X.52 ME and AA have continued to work mornings & in N.M.. They have finished washing, reading and putting in order all the Pushkin, including the new - last estimates - lot, and have nearly finished putting the supplemental series in order in the drawers; tomorrow being a holiday, Wednesday, will finish them.

The floor of our work - plan has still not been fully cleared.

26.XII.52 Me and AT have been working mornings regularly at the N.M.

On 23.XII there was a heavy rainstorm, as a result of which  
the AA 2 piles of barrels washed and waiting boxes in a  
(unpainted, but roof, apothecary  
"shelter" place were, say, .30 deep in water, even <sup>on 24.XII</sup>  
in room where the cabinets stand, the floor was covered, still say  
(nobody could go through them again)  
2 fingers deep. Cabinets not visible from outside, couldn't  
say how near actually where they stand.

5.I.53 This being a fine day, go to NM & check the new Kinidin and  
finish plot. (ME) of new types and take files home for  
the "winter," also to take notes of how things stand, progress  
and conditions & damp, as we have had new deluges  
of rain in recent days.

7.I.53 It turned out there was far too much to do, even of photography,  
Wed. for one day. C.I. was a holiday. I went again today,  
but never decided to wait now till prints have been made and  
filed of the pictures of the new types. Neither day was there a  
great deal of water on the floor, but there was some, and the  
earthenware drawers were damp at the back.

14.I.53 We now have prints of Rolls 207, 208, 209, and except for the  
last, the pictures have been attached to the cards. ME and AT  
have worked mornings at the museum, reading, and finally  
lating out cards for corrugated types (less K) and for different  
& plots. They came 8-10.I., and AT also 12.I., when

ME was at the dig, going through Miss K.'s new and corrected cards. This took long, and into some chores on Thursday, kept her at the dig also 13.I., when we received prints of the last of the finished film, 209.

Today I have come, we were to photograph, but the light is too faint to give a reading on my meter. (I find 210 is the new camera, and begin 211 in the old camera, when I will know & explain the difference in opening and a gadget.).

While ME is photographing, I was to proceed sorting & new types, but AA decided not to bring the stuff over first thing in the morning, because it was not a good photographing day, so he arrived just about when I did, and ME has had us turn to put the corrected cards back in the file, now & take out those on which new plots are to be attached. progress going along rapidly. A few sorted off.

20.I.53 At the museum: Note on situation and progress. I have worked

There are 13 more Th., the three seen by Mr. B., and some Scaphops of small groups (not aid. LK & KK) from AAE, sorted out by me when putting pile into basket, in the basket remain the miscellaneous unselected (some of whom brought to the cabinet). Some photographic work, not ~~all~~, successful, has been done in the National Museum since January: ME worked Feb. 23-25 with wrong adjustment (quadr-twin at  $\frac{1}{30}$ !) Firing this out from developing of first film, sent to stop further work. The definitively numbered (KT 2-130 selected) Roll 212, seems to have been exposed Feb. 26. Then April 8, she used up second part of Roll 213 there, on KT 156-283, selected; and April 9, first part of Roll 214, KT 133-335, selected (some repeats for past failures). All this was on superior examples of established <sup>Kuidin</sup> types, really to put in time, because I was too busy to direct her to other matters.

On April 30 I saw Chr. Karousos on the proposed cabinets: <sup>N. MUS.</sup> See a STORAGE folder for this call, and subsequent business of preparation of these drawers.

Tomorrow, May 18, ME is to begin again on identification of Kuidin types, to be sorted by AA. No more plot. of " " till sorting done, preferably. But have in mind study and plot of the miscel. non-Kuid., non-Blod. perhaps before Kuidin done, in interest of a report to go into <sup>Not yet</sup> *Siliconomas Festschrift*.

18.V.53 Went to N.M. with AT to help me (not them) to set up for identifying Kruken types, again. Brought along Master folio, & check again cabinet space, as I had wrongly estimated wall-space needed, and thought we might leave underestimates worst needed. (But it seems to be just rt.) MZ read in epigraphical court, beginning with stuff assembled in baskets from last January. She is to work there now regularly morning, with AT to help (wash, sort, etc.) as needed.

11.VI.53 Called on MZ at about 11:00 a.m., following errands. Pleasant, though it "difficult - rectangular" Kruken as it now stands. This is the leap from which she has been drawing since May 18 when she came, except for a few baskets waiting to be done, left in January. The larger part of the "difficult. circular" has been finished then. It might sound better to finish up one category before starting another, but it really makes little difference, and one needs as much appetite as possible for this kind of work. Went into her apartment where are the files of identified and sorted Kruken, plus, there also. It seems to me that what remains to be done is not more than  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the whole, but on the whole a difficult portion. MZ in fact would work less assembled about 35 new types (a good many, not fully read) and as many <sup>types</sup> corrected by examples here, which I must work through and they must be plotted. Some have been held for photography because of being

superior examples. A hundred or so have been classed as illegible. The rest are on their proper files  
in an apothecary  
 note to sorts identified, distinguishable by not being  
in the cabinet  
 dusty. She is working in the corner of the court of  
the Epigraphical Museum. The sun is not at least, but  
 there is a certain amount of side light reflected from across

How long time my old <sup>no. 3 accessory part</sup> lens, and my old plumb bob - the Attracine - made one - to plot stamps in Gordon. M2 read bands also, on both mornings, as she has been doing regularly, missing 16. VI because of rain.

1. VIII. 53 all of us at the museum today, and we have started to sort the Kudian in more detail, taking the first of the four large heaps begun 26. VII. 52 - see p. 6 of "Kudian at the N.M.", and laying out the wooden markers prepared earlier in November, and not used because the floor was not clean enough. The two boys cleaned out the pieces of wood (not the comb) and AD got a broom from RIBOS and swept the floor of this impurity! ① KT 1-20  
 I laid out the markers for the first 400 types, along the E wall of the long room, beginning by the main door. (cf. 204.19, print att. to "Kudian" p. 6, for MS and AA working by this wall in Nov.). AS is sorting into these piles, by his own methods. New examples up to 400 will now be put out here, by hundreds.

Saw Semini, who agreed we should bring cabinets next Monday. (Mrs. Roosevelt, there.)

AA will go on by himself tomorrow, laying out markers for second heap whose first is done.

On 2. VIII. 53, he got a start on second heap. (Talk with Judge Brewster, and saw work in progress.)

3. VIII AA was in the museum, working mostly, but he sorted for about an hour into ten smaller piles of the first half of the Kudian types. (MS thought he was tired of working 3 morning in succession: he has worked too long in preparation for their sorting and putting in drawers.)

8.VII.53 See journal of N.M. STORAGE for activities these days. In addition, I have types & material yesterday and today - to date the new Kindai types, which MZ needs to have a file. While I work on file, she sorts Drápops, which are well record and put away when they have been classified and labelled. They include some unrecognized Pleotrich. AD continues today to sort the second large heap into smaller heaps.

10.VII.53 During 8.VII. I <sup>also</sup> checked some doubtful Pleotrich (26-5 making note also on fabric of their handles).

9.VII. I worked ~~a little~~ on new Kii. types, with much interruption over sorting, and putting away <sup>in</sup> small groups. (Later, due to several errands en route worked on loosening file. <sup>not to boat agency for island</sup>) Today finished 1st page of new K. types for Miss K. to get on with. MZ and AD want to agree about 9:30, as they could not work profitably at in N.M. today (MZ needing Kindai files, <sup>too</sup>).  
On 11.VII., MZ and AD mark and sorted handles with new types placed last winter. (Rolls in 204-211); placed handles now in front of their heaps are to KT number on piece of paper to call attention them. She started 15 pl. (roll 219). AD started to ~~read~~ identify Kindai, before we left. Agreed today, Monday, they continued in their jobs,

Sunday, July 12, 1953

Dear Maria,

If I can go to Eleusis with Prog. Mylona, and get back early, I shall do that tomorrow morning, coming to the National Museum perhaps half past eleven, or whatever time I can. Please wait for me there until half past ~~over~~ twelve, but not longer.

Andreas Dimoulinos should go on reading, writing the numbers in ink, you & show him, if he has trouble.

I would like you to put away the Rhodian, first marking the N. numbers on the drawer list, in red, as I have started. A copy of Nilsson is on Mr. Mitoss' shelf.

There remain 2-3 rolls

This actually turned out to be almost unnecessary, because if one inserts the upper <sup>metal</sup> of two drawers, one can put the file section between them, and it is impossible to remove it when the ordinary bars prevent pulling out the drawers. But it turns out ~~turns~~ there is a guard with Miss, or Niles who belongs to Papad. who is still in Mycene. This Niles says he will be there until Teppo comes back. Me and I go & have word with X.K. to say everything seems to be cleared up, since there is this Niles. X.K says good, because he doesn't want us coming in and out by the way, the building are otherwise responsible for, and in any case the whole difficulty is only for 5 days, after which Teppo comes back to the E.M. as his job upstairs stops. We go back and say goodbye. Thank you for all your help, & Niles, and just he expects to lose Niles in a day, or so when Mr. Papad. comes back, and Teppo <sup>comes</sup> is going to keep him whole <sup>7 days</sup>.

Now the question is, how long can Niles stay, and if he can't, can we be let <sup>gates</sup> through to the E.M. by somebody, with a key from upstairs, or can we tell Teppo & sort handles by numbers with Andree.

In the meanwhile, our files, desks, chairs, file-stands, and most if not all of the wooden handles have been brought back into the apothecary with the cabinets, the files sorted in place. The remaining, unsorted can be attended to after the E.M. reopens.
