Sehr verehrte Miss Grace,

heute endlich kann ich Ihnen Ihren Bericht über die Henkel vom Dipylon zurücksenden. Wir haben die Strassenbezeichnung der jetzt gültigen Zählung entsprechend geändert, eine Angabe über die Zahl der gefundenen Münzen hinzugefügt; unter den genannten Personen habe ich Gruben mehr hervorgehoben, weil er die Unternehmung am Dipylon geleitet hat; datiert wurden die Münzen von Dr. Franke, unserem Numismatiker. Gegen den Druck des Berichts in der Hesperia haben wir keinen Einwand.

Dear Professor Willemsen,

I am grateful for your permission to continue my work on the stamped handles found at the Kerameikos, and for the kindness and courtesy shown to me and to those helping me by the members of your staff in the workrooms when I was there, October 29 - November 1, with a short call on November 2. Thanks to Dr. Vierneisel's provision of wooden cases to take the whole collection of handles, we were able this time to rearrange them and store them in a way that makes individual items and related groups more accessible for study than was possible before. In the course of this work we made many checks, and took some photographs. We also numbered and made a preliminary record of about 100 new finds, GA 1673-1775, of which the last 7 belong to a particular group in which Dr. Vierneisel was interested. On this group, see the enclosed pages dated 8.XII.62.

The difference between the sum, 1776, and the last number given, 1775, is due to a slight duplication in numbering.

The ten handles not seen by us are GA 1367-1374, and 1626-1627. These are, I believe, with other finds in cases of context pottery from the excavations. Other handles evidently now so stored are GA 1348-1366, but these were recorded in 1959 by rubbings; finally, the Dipylon group, GA 1769-1775, are being kept out for the present for study.

The rest of the handles are now in 41 cases assembled together on shelves in the long apothecary. Beside them is an empty case for new unnumbered handles. Within the cases, the numbered handles are laid in order in layers separated by newspapers, which serve more or less as trays. The Knidian are in order by the type numbers of their stamps.

Mislaid Kerameikos papers, now found, which should help to fill missing handles.

By chance (looking for HAT recent Encyclopedic articles on the Agora) I found a folder filed under GRACE, in which were numerous copies of Kerameikos records which had been given to the Gym Institute and had apparently been returned to Judite P. after she left that job. The folder contains also some notes on whereabouts of certain handles, and it is to bad we did not have these notes before ^{doing} recent job, so as to be able to give an up-to-date report of assortment instead of having gaps for handles we did not find.

Duplicates were begun yesterday of KGA 1673 ff. by AD. The old KGA numbers (found later to have been duplicated by a series of which rubbings - and duplicates - had been made) are being entered below the new, valid, ones. Must try & find out if Judith made any inventory entries in any records kept at the Karamitos of SA numbers given.

AD is currently keeping a list of plates needed. But I think it will be best for him not to try too much to distinguish superior examples among the Kudus, but when rubbings are pasted, and tortoulas cut, and put into KT order, compare one plate with the rest, check against KT plate file.

Kerameikos Notes

On Monday last, 3.VIII.59, ME and AD went
for whom morning, for checking various difficult
items not finished from the rubbings done (ME), for
numbering and later rubbing of some new items (AD, who
also laid things out in rows so wanted objects could be
found, they being stored now in bins).

The new items are I believe partly from excavations,
for which some context will be available.

Last item at present is KGA 1366.

A number of more recently numbered items
skipped.

Clearing up papers, I find the original and
first carbon of duplicates of Kerameikos later finds,
dated at the beginning 3.II.59.
KGA 1181-1366, & the drawings have been light, these
will be kept on the shelf with other similar (broken
on west wall of room) at least while they are in
duplicate. The card copy has been cut, and the
parcels filed with the old small parcels that
are the original record of KGA 1-1180. Note that
these old parcels still bear their original K and KGA





Dear Virginia - thank you very much for the concordance, I expect Dr. Ohly will come to thank you in person.

George Zoumanides has spent part of his time in the Kerameikos putting the handles in order. He has arranged the old ones (the ones you have recorded) in numerical order in neatly labelled tins and he has numbered the new ones (the ones you have not yet recorded). Mr. Benachi made rubbings of the new ones until he ran out of cigarette paper - this was just before he left. At the present moment I would like some more cigarette paper in order to finish the rubbings.

The demolition of four houses is producing a few new handles every day. Since I am still dealing with boxes, not yet having reached the stage of individual finds, and since I have no help, I thought I might wait until demolition had produced a worthwhile number of handles and then see if it would be possible to get help from the Agora in numbering and taking rubbings. Or photos.

Some amphoras with dipinti have turned up and one with a ~~graffito~~⁺ ΓΑΥΚΥC. Quite a few grey-ware amphoras turned up among Brueckner's old finds.

Dear Dr. Ohly,

Here is the drawing for the skeleton cabinet for stamped handles, such as has been used by the French in Delos and Thasos, and ^{by us} for two large collections in Alexandria, as well as, in recent times, here at the Agora. I have put in also a few photographs, to show how it works. They would probably help a carpenter to understand the drawing. Be sure the drawers are not made to fit closely in width, either: there should be a full centimeter of play; some made recently in Delos are too big, and stick.

I enclose also lists of the handles we found at the Kerameikos, both to which those with old numbers, and those which were not numbered, and we have given them numbers (distinguishable by the initials VG). Finally, here is a list also of sacks, cases and boxes in which we found the handles, and to which they have been returned. When we worked for an hour or so in the apothekē on June 4, 1957 (the day we met you there), we found a few more items which had apparently turned up in the course of cleaning the apothekē: these care Kerameikos 335, 339, 340 (old numbers) and Kerameikos VG 816-818. 817 and 818 (necks of Knidian jars) were in a case with many other fragments which may join with them.

My trip to Samos is postponed until next Tuesday. I think you told me you have no objection if rubbings are taken of the handles from the old excavations. Please let me know if I can do anything in Samos for you or for others.

ELW needed to look again at the Roman pieces in the Kerameikos, which were "all in all", before publication, as they she had not seen them since 1951 when she was beginning her studies. As she is leaving for ^{Tübingen} tomorrow night, we managed to get in today if possible. We telephoned M. Miltiadis, who told us to go to the Ministry and ask for a paper; Mavromatis was to be there till 2:00. In fact he was not there, and Miltiadis instructed me to write an application on the spot, longhand, and he would see to it, and we could have it by Monday. Monday was the day of a ^{μεσημέρι} trousseau, one of the building & the Greek authorities. However, nobody saw any of us on this occasion, and the ^{εγγραφός} reached us just about 6:00, by train, to Niles in the office downstairs. Today, Tuesday, we began at 9:15 to try to reach M. Miltiadis for a copy; Telephoned several times, at considerable intervals, he was not on the Acropolis yet. Finally we took our stuff to the Kerameikos, and they called for them. They told us to come to the excavations on the 5 sides, in order to leave. When we got there, we had gone to the Acropolis. We were greeted, not very pleasantly, by Miss Tsiropoulou. M. Miltiadis' assistant, who said we should not leave from straight to the Kerameikos. (!!) Fuss made by M., who complained of the ^{εγγραφός} concocted by Miltiadis's, said it should have requested publication rights - where was our permit & public? Finally given us a guard (^{a man boy} Αρχαιοκάπιταγιαννόπουλος). We got into the 2nd story after 11:30, and left again after 1:30.





Dear Dr. Kübler:

Two American girls who have been with us lately on holiday from their studies at Tübingen tell me the city is charming, and fortunately not damaged. I was glad when I heard it was your home.

I am writing to find out something about the stamped amphora handles from the Kerameikos, which I saw, in their sacks and cases, yesterday. I believe that you or your Institute gave me permission before the war to study these stamps, and to use them in publication, but I find I have nothing in writing to this effect. The Greek Archaeological Service has agreed that I may study and photograph them as far as they are concerned, and arrangements have been made tentatively. But I noticed yesterday that the handles have been numbered, and to some extent sorted, so I am wondering whether someone else has started to prepare a publication.

I should be much obliged if you would tell me whether this material is free for me to use, and if it is, whether there are records about it to which I may have access. I am assembling an index, and the aim for this year is to get in the handles in Athens. The publication plan is for a Corpus, if money can be found, and in the meanwhile for illustrated studies, with as broad a basis as possible, of particular groups, sequences, etc.

I should be glad of your permission to use also whole wine jars, even though unstamped. The study of these is of course a necessary part of the study of the stamps - or vice versa. I have this year sorted out some hundreds of jars at the Agora, and shelved them by date and class.

The Agora staff and director, Homer Thompson, are assembled and working, but very little excavating is going on, or planned for this season, owing to lack of funds. Investigations this year will mostly be concerned with the Stoa of Attalos, so it may be ready for reconstruction. I have my personal interest here, because many stamped handles are found in the various strata underlying the Stoa.



Memorandum for the Director

It would be a very great convenience for me to have for study in my workrooms at the Agora the stamped handles from the Kerameikos excavations.

These are about 1200, stored in 2 larger boxes (holding perhaps 100 each), 9 smaller boxes, and 16 small burlap sacks. The sacks and boxes were seen in June 1948 by E.V. in the long storeroom at the Kerameikos, position as indicated in the accompanying sketch.

The reading and tabulation of these handles will take us probably two months, of work which will have to be done mostly in the late afternoon, the hours which my assistants can give me. The majority of the stamps will undoubtedly be Knidian, fifty percent of which cannot be read in full without the help of our index (six drawers of file cards) and a strong reading light. It would probably be as inconvenient for the Kerameikos Museum to have us working there, occupying so much space and time, as it would be for us to have to transport back and forth our apparatus, which is needed also at the Agora. It is also often useful, in the case of stamp types not yet fully established, to be able to compare actual handles with possible duplicates in the large Agora collection.

The Ministry has agreed to have other Kerameikos material studied at the Agora: the bones examined by Angel. I should call for the handles personally, and take the lot all at once or in parts, as preferred by the authorities.

The recording of the Kerameikos handles is part of my program for this year as Fulbright Fellow, and would fit best into the schedule as soon as conveniently possible.

I am most obliged for your attention to this matter.

Today, with delay my fault, stood about at 9:50, to clean first photos, and put things away. It will of course be necessary to get out a van and now and then, since nothing is yet published, nor ever listed by birds.

The cases which have been standing open, with handles taken out and put back, sometimes in haste by us, are now cleaned; the handles laid out in numerical order; and repacked in boxes in their cases. The order is that #9 numbers go in first, smallest or both. Old Keramides numbers always on top, in case of recognition by somebody. Cleaned is left margin of original case list. ME and I passing the box A. Andrade's laying out in numerical order for cleaning and packing.

Left at ca. 12:30, not finished.

^{9:15} 30.VII.52 Brought drill, and Spino attaches wooden labels to padded cases. ME pads case 20 (large). Also case 21, and cleans and repacks some sacks which had sat open.

I have read through this journal. We have attached to most of the wooden labels made for us by Cl. Andrade 2 years ago. The cases and sacks being returned to Dr. long apostole, and set in fair numerical order, all labelled.

Dear V,

I went to the Kerameikos again this morning to look at some things and this time I succeeded in locating the stamped Amphora Handles. The accompanying sketch shows where they are. There are 9 herring boxes (@ ca. 50 ?), 2 boxes for kerosene tins (@ ca 100 ?) and sixteen small burlap sacks (@ ca 35 ?), which gives roughly 1200 pieces. They are sorted by kind apparently and many of them have numbers. They are quite accessible and it would probably be worth your while to have a look at them when you come.

Last time I wrote you, I realized the moment I dropped the letter in the box that I

I had never answered your letter
about Boehringer. I'm afraid
that I haven't much to say.
As far as I know I have never

Dear Mr. Vanderpool,

It was nice to hear from you and I am glad you have been successful in your excavations of last year. It seems that you have found at last the tombs of the kings of Mycenean Athens-- since there was a palace, there must be the tombs too, and here they are. I hope you will be equally successful in your further campaigns.

The stamped amphora handles in the kerameikos I remember well, but since I didn't know whether Kubler had found any more in the meantime and how many they could be altogether, I asked Kubler. (His address is: Dr. K.K., Tübingen (14b) Lustnau, Linsenbergstr. 25). He tells me that he does not remember how many there are, one or two cases full in all, certainly not thousands of them, but perhaps a few hundreds. Of course they do not occur in the deeper stratas, which were explored during the last twenty years in the kerameikos area, so that their number is of doubtful "statistic" value. Many of them we found in the Pompeion in 1931, others might have been found in earlier excavations and thrown away. I remember a fairly large wooden case full of them. It should still be in the long and small magazine near the old museum ("langer Schuppen"). Perhaps Miss Grace will be allowed by the Greek authorities to look at them. There should be written "Amphorenstempel" or something like that on the outside of the case. Kubler did not look at them since 10 years as he tells me-- and shan't be able to do so in future I fear, nor will the Greeks ~~do~~.

Thank you, we are rather well as circumstances go. Please remember me to Miss Grace, Mr. Thompson and whoever is there, also to Mr. Hill and Robinson. I am trying to write some "popular" archaeological books for earning-- rather interesting. I hope to give lectures soon again.

Dear V

Thank you for ~~the~~ your letter of Aug. 19 from Detroit. I am glad the Lake cards arrived at long last - and it is a long last, for I first undertook to deliver them well over a year ago. When I finished UNRRA in Aug. 1946, I planned to go to America - chiefly because UNRRA would send me free, (worst of all possible reasons). Someone fastened on me and said Oh you can take these cards. So I put them in an empty suitcase which went inside an otherwise empty trunk, both of which I was taking to America to bring back full. In the end I didn't go to America after all, but as the trunk and suitcase were "empty" I never bothered to open them and they were put in the cellar. In the course of the winter the question of the lake cards,

came up several times. No one could put their finger on them, and I vowed I knew nothing about them. Alison said she thought I had done something about them, but I swore I hadn't. Came the summer of 1947 and we had a house in Glyphaða for a couple of months and needed a trunk to ~~not~~ pack sheets and the like in. My trunk was opened, and there were the lake cards. They were mailed right off, and I see reached you in about six weeks. Moral: don't let anyone tell you that "by safe hand" is the best and quickest way to send things. I'm sorry - but *Kádlo áþjá waga* *itto*.

Some time last spring I went to the Kerameikos with Threpsiades to look for some inscriptions for Ben Meint. We went into the Museum, workrooms, store rooms,

everywhere, but didn't find them. We also kept an eye out for amphora handles, but, believe it or not, we saw none. There must be some there, but they will be in boxes ~~assorted~~ of which there are thousands (all we saw seemed to have shards only), or in some cupboard or room we didn't see. The Kerameikos is all kept locked up, and I don't know when I'll get there again, or where I'd look if I did. I guess we will have to await the return of the Germans!

I could perhaps write to Kraiker, whose address I have, to see if he remembers where they are kept and whether there are many.

In Samos at the Heraion the wooden shelves were all taken by the Italians and the pottery is said to be all dumped in a pile on the floor. I don't know about Tigran or Vathy. I don't know

when anyone will be going
there.

The handles here have not
been many or sensational this
year. I remember one with a
device which recalled the Mandean
(?) one - Diompos on a donkey (?)
but I didn't compare them at
the time, and I can't put my
finger on the new one now.
