Further Work on Material from Meliadi's 1957 Excav.

See note of 29. I. on my letter of 28. I. to Mr. M. We made, then, an appointment one day to go to the mosque the next day, but it turned out cloudy, not reliable enough for photo. Mr. M. later gave X. K. permission - authority - to send the guard down himself, before he should arrive in his office, so that we could decide to go when we knew the weather.

The past weeks have not produced any wholly fine days until last Sat., on which day we had a school. This morning however being fine, I called X. at the house (871-938) at ca. 8:35, and by 9:35 was at the mosque with photographic paraphernalia, and Soleri to carry it and help set it up.

The light was good, and the reading 12, and late 15, with the hood off. At 22, west exposures of 10 seconds, and late ca. 8 seconds, on Pan-Xa. Work on with Roll 465, begins in Dec. at the N. Miss. M's cause toward 11:45, and finishes the film, while I had another look about. There is still material for a full film to be taken, we hope to get this developed first.

Charistein said Mr. M.'s idea is that we shall publish this group, and that no photo shall be published before this takes place. Further, the excavations must be pub. first, and then the finds, of which different categories,

OVER

prepared by various persons, must be ready at the same time. It seems likely there will be considerable delay before all this is done. We hope we may be able to make special arrangements for some needed items.

Among these is a good set of unpostmarked rather late Roman, which would be useful in the Corpus, especially as it seems to come from a cistern with dateable other things. Mr. M., through X. K., is ascertaining the date of the jars in the cistern. I have asked our Task his permission for us to photograph some of them.

Yesterday (Tues.) while it rained, Nitin slept. Roll 465, which seemed satisfactory, when looked at early today.

Today early seemed fine again, so I called X.K. and joined him, a bit late (ca. 10:45). Mr. M. had agreed to having us photograph some of the jars, but said he would like to have prints. Me, being telephoned, brought tripod & set them up and a roll of ~~the~~ background paper. She took over photography of handles, which I had begun. I made selection of jars, and of tolerable place to photograph them - outside, against a window on the #5 side of the mosque, tying up with wire a $17 \times 4\frac{1}{2}$ ft. of wood to fasten the paper to. Paper attached. We began bringing out jars, but it started to rain - had begun to be cloudy almost as soon as I started to phot. handles. So we took everything in. Me photographed most of the rest

of the handles, while Xap. and I, and Tzatzapáke, measured and described the selected jars.

We left about 12:40 by taxi, having finished photographing the Chandles, and naming 9 jars. M^s picked out a tenth which he thought somewhat different from any of the others. Perhaps it will be included - (Varadaraj & Basel)

4. IV. 60 Came this morning rather late (after 11:00) and have been photographing the 9 jars outside the mosquito, as set up to other bins. It is cloudy, and misting a little from bin to bin, with occasional patches of sun. Light meter reads from 25 with cover open to 10 with cover closed. Have camera without slow timer. Have been opening and closing with slight interval. The jars are shot in numerical order (see list you made & describe 24. IV. 60) ^{as follows} ^{24. IV. 60} ⁱⁿ any details following the photo of the jar as a whole.

Note no. 8 has ^{too} ^{broken} parts, so right-side-up photo has bottom missing.

Charles Kavallianou had asked us to look at
these brangles, she having taken part in the excavation,
and in the cataloguing. She spoke of it a number of
times. Mr. Miliades also wanted us to help with this
material.

On Dec. 22²³, 1958, while I was in America, M.E. and
AD went to the mosque where these finds are kept,
and AD took 2 sets of rubbings, one for them, one for
us. Ms X.K. had already made inventory cards for these
objects, in the general inventory series, and M.E. took notes
from the cards as to finding-place groups (which are
numerous in this excavation with simple numbers in a
single series as in Pergamon current dig). She also
took notes on birds.

On January 20, 1959, she started to make the duplicates,
from these notes and the rubbings.

The total of these brangles has been added up: 314.

Detailed count will be easier when duplicates have been
separated and cards out. If possible, best to take first
the necessary plaster, which are about 50.

Today - now - we go to the mosque, M.E. and I, she
to find and put together the selected brangles for plaster,
and I to have a general look, and to see if photography

could be done there in or near the mosque.

Then I shall apply to Mr. M. for permission to photograph them, and if necessary to take them away for this purpose.

Photography of handles can be done conveniently in the doorway, which naturally opens west, and the sun strikes a building opposite, certainly from 10:20 am, probably good for a couple of hours after that.





The handles are now all laid out in order in a tray which was brought for the purpose, at we expect, 11:25. Light is still fine for photography.

The stamp C.S is very close to that of SS 12705. The fragments must be contemporary. Hunting for a handle in shape between this kind of top and the Bridled-type handle, I come rather by accident on plot. of jar from ^{nearby full} Corinto Well in SE Bldg (finished 146 BC) — (Row 369, 21) C 47-848. It certainly fits up to top, although it is at a different point in the series: the "shoulder" angle

of 35.12705 shows, above, a definite slope (not just a recess); and the toe of NAA has a ^{but} higher in proportion than that of the Corinth jar.

This ^{change} could well happen in ca. 40 years in the same series. So if the C.S. stamped frags. are earlier than the Mummiidate of the Corinth jar, maybe they are MSBF period, i.e. before ca. 185 B.C. On the other hand, can't be sure they are not later.

Maybe, as pts out, the context of the Abro. toe will help to decide. ☺
