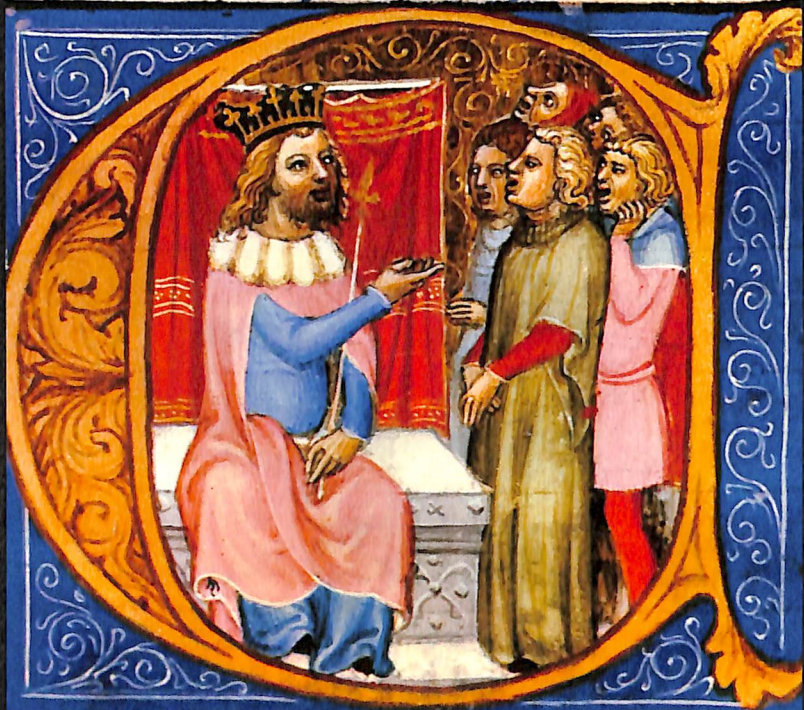

The Rhodian amphora, Pl. , 1, was recorded in Larnaka, Cyprus, in 1939 by permission of its owners, Mr. and Mrs. Zenon ~~Παπακωνσταντίνου~~ ^{Pierides}. I am glad to acknowledge the ~~παπακωνσταντίνου~~ kindness and hospitality on that occasion of Mrs. Pierides and of her late husband.

The Knidian amphora is from the American Excavations of the Athenian Agora, and I am obliged to Professor Homer A. Thompson and Professor T. Leslie Shear, Jr., for permission to publish it here, as well as to make reference to other Agora finds and to Agora deposits. I am grateful to the direction of the Agora Excavations over many years for the opportunity to investigate the patterns of stamping of the various classes of Greek container amphoras, which now emerge with a firmness and clarity not attainable without access to the Agora records of context of discovery, or without considerable time to coordinate these with many other data on amphora stamps now

The clay of the handle is very micaceous.

Three other examples of this type are known, all found in Athens: KGA 1818 from the Kerameikos excavations and NAA 103 and 1208 from Meliades' excavations on the south slope of the Akropolis ^{in 1957 and 1960}. For permission to mention material from the south slope, I thank Dr. Meliades, also Mrs. Maria Petropoulakou to whom publication of these handles has been assigned. For the Kerameikos item, I am grateful to Professor Willemssen of the German Archaeological Institute in Athens. The type was first read in 1964, and has not yet received a K(nidian) T(ype) number; on these numbers, see Grace and Petropoulakou, p. 323; the type of 6 is one of the 26 new types that had accumulated after 1959.

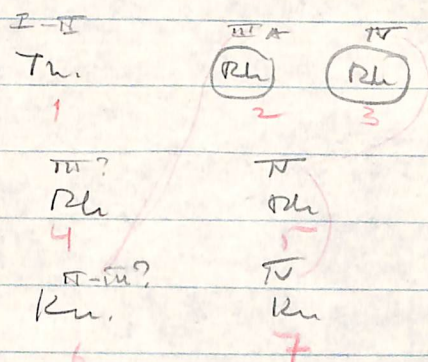

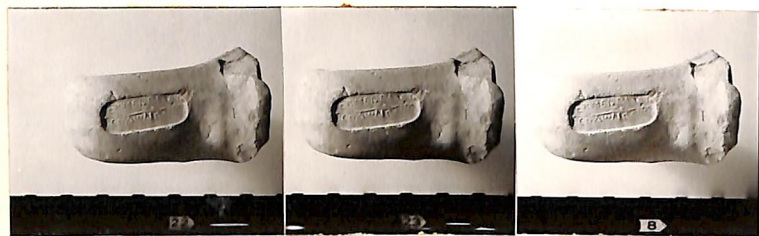
