



Αγαπητή Δίς Γκρέϊς,
προλίγου η Πόλυ μου έδωσε τό γράμμα σας γραμμένο στις 29.10. Σās γρά-
φω άμέσως για νά σās πώ πόσο ώραία περάσαμε τήν έβδομάδα μας στην Ρό-
δο, τήν όποία μέ μεγάλη λύπη έγκαταλείψαμε τήν Δευτέρα 31.10, για νά
γυρίσωμε στα ίδια. Πράγματι η Ρόδος αυτή τήν έποχή είναι πολύ ώραία.
Τό άφθονο πράσινο και τά πολύχρωμα άνθισμένα λουλουδια τήν κάνουν ένα
νησί πού μόνο σε παραμύθια θά μπορούσε κανείς νά περιγράψη όσα έχει.
Σάν συμπλήρωμα σε όλη αυτή τήν όμορφιά είχαμε και τό καλοκαίρι, πού
άκόμα συνεχίζεται στην Ρόδο, και έτσι είχαμε τήν τύχη νά κάνωμε τά
τελευταία μπάνια μας.

Κάνωμε αρκετές έκδρομές στα διάφορα αξιοθέατα του νησιού, Λίνδο (μέ
γαΐδουράκι), Κόμιρο, Φιλέρημο, Πεταλούδες, Προφήτη Ήλία, και στα διάφορα
προάστεια της πόλεως όπως τό Ροδίσι, Καλλιθέα κ.ά.

Επισκεφθήκαμε τό μουσειό και τίς άνασκαφές πού βρέθηκαν οι άμφορείς.
Από τό δωμάτιο αυτό των άμφορέων έχουν βγάλει περίπου 100 άμφορείς τους
όποιους τους έχουν πλύνει και ό Κώστας έχει αρχίσει νά τους συγκολλά
στην αύλή στο πίσω μέρος του εργαστηρίου του. Όλοι σχεδόν είναι σπα-
σμένοι, αλλά οι σφραγιδες τους σώζονται σε καλή κατάσταση. Προτού τους
βγάλουν από τό δωμάτιο τους έχουν δώσει ένα νούμερο κατά σειρά πού βρί-
σκονται τοποθετημένοι, γιατί όπως μου εξήγησε ό Κώστας πρόκειται μετά
τό καθάρισμα και τό κόλλημα νά ξανατοποθετηθούν στην θέσι τους για νά
τους φωτογραφίσουν. Κατόρθωσα νά κοιτάξω 19 από αυτούς τους άμφορείς
και νά πάρω μερικά ράμπινς. Από τους 19 οι 9 είναι ό τύπος Ήενότιμος
μέ Πausanία σε στρογγυλή σφραγιδα, οι 8 Μίνυθος μέ Πausanία σε τετράγω-
νη σφραγιδα, ένας μέ σφραγιδα μπουτόν και ένας καινούργιος τύπος Παυ-
σανίας του Τελέσωνος και στις δύο λαβές.

Έχω βγάλει φωτογραφίες από τό δωμάτιο μέ τους άμφορείς όπως έχει
τώρα, έχω φωτογραφίσει επίσης έναν από αυτούς τους άμφορείς, επίσης
τό μέρος πού βρίσκονται όλοι οι άλλοι πού έχουν βγάλει για νά συγκολλ-
λήθουν. Δυστυχώς δεν έχω πάρει άκόμα τίς φωτογραφίες ώστε νά γνωρίζω
για τήν έπιτυχία τους και για νά σās στείλω. Έχω επίσης μερικές πα-
ραγγελίες από τόν κύριο Κωνσταντινόπουλο για τίς όποιες και για πολ-
λά άλλα θά μιλήσωμε όταν έλθετε.

Σās στέλνω ράμπινς από τους δύο αυτούς τύπους των άμφορέων και έ-
να από τόν καινούργιο τύπο του Πausanία.

Soleil amples in storage

Nida took a photo, she said.



Note that a single one of these amplores is old-style, with mushroom rim. No post presence. General effect like the published pair of Δυμύτιος (Greece 1986, no. 25). This ^{one} is MS 387 = A 48, pair of Δαμορικός, cf. Εὐκείης - no mouth, more or less better stamps. Battered - rim chipped. (Εὐκείης is known with mouth.)

* The same (?) Δαμορικός endorses a pair no. of amplores in the deposit, with rect. stamps mostly having the mouth in the job-type.

I know the one such a pair, but don't see it noted in the Soleil folder. It is, though. III. 89

Grouping of jars in Seleid deposits

M.B.W. has made a full concordance of jar numbers on jars, with M.E. numbers. ^{For} Thus 1st nos. see A.D. letters to me of 30.XI.60. at this time opposite the planned to return them to their room ^{in which they had been found} for photographs. So the marked jars, and ^{but corresponded} nos. on the jars in the big pile after mending. Lists by this nos. of 2.II.61 (printed) 9.II.61 (typed), with jars beyond the '40s, where the total no. was 137. These lists of course don't have M.E. nos., but they have names etc. & identify them.

M.B.W. has made a start at plotting the arrangement of jars, by working out where in the group plots were the jars of individual potters. E.g. the jars of Kyriakos are almost (?) all together, and there is at least a good group of jars of $\Xi\upsilon\delta\omicron\tau\epsilon\mu\omicron\varsigma$. (I can check this position, as I took a rubbing of one of these while they were still in original positions.)

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Layout of jars in Solid deposits

I found one central point, in that I had taken a rubber ^{with the handle of a} 9th 4th jar in the 2nd row in my pick, Amphora, fig. 63, left side, and found it to be a jar of Xanthos w. no. 10.

This jar can be identified in the point they gave me of the whole lot, with numbers on the jars. It is jar 13, and in fact it is a jar of Evot., = MS 410, according to the "Row no. 13" in our record, taken from the jars; and entered in the dupl.

Records of Soleil jars, now being measured by MBW. These are now kept in the ^{Jars} ~~store~~ ^{Γαση ἀποθήκη} of the Εργαστήριο. They are generally in a state of repair, and individually available as they are stored.

The jars were recorded by Maria and Nick Reed (see ~~list~~ ^{list}) in ~~1966~~ ^{July} 1966, just by rubbings being taken and numbers (n^o) written on rubbing out on jars. In the duplicates no description save that of a diam. has been taken for jars that were plint. on Roll 649, and these are entered in the duplicates. Jars (and their stamps) plint. on Roll 700 must have been measured, but the n^os. ~~are not~~ ^{are not} in the plint. list, have not been transferred to the duplicates.







Here are some interim notes on stamped jars found last summer in an ancient cellar, in the city of Rhodes. Altogether there were 137 of these jars, neatly laid out, upside down. Although Mr. Benachi did not go to Rhodes last summer, did he, I think you must have heard some rumour of this depot. Unfortunately all the jars needed mending, and this proceeds slowly. Friends on trips to Rhodes have taken rubbings from the stamps on the finished jars. On 31, 35, and 40: 40 has two ^{com,} supplementary stamps, in which the month is with the fabricant, in a stamp for which we have no exact parallel on file, and the reading is not quite certain. Apparently there are two other jars on which the eponym stamp, ^{used on 40} has been impressed ~~twice~~ on both handles, no doubt by mistake, the fabricant stamp not appearing. TEAEZEN as a patronymic is not otherwise known to me, but an eponym TEAEZEN is named on some early Rhodian handles which I should date about a generation before this ΠΑΥΣΑΝΙΑΣ.

It was nice to get a glimpse of you in December, and I am looking forward to seeing Ruth and Alexander this summer. I wish I had a house to put them in.

Dear Mr. Konstantinopoulos,

This letter will be brought by Mr. and Mrs. Kiang who have been staying at the American School and are special friends of mine. I shall be very grateful for any help or advice you can give to these people, who, I am sure you will agree, are ΣΥΜΠΑΘΕΣΤΑΤΟΙ. Mr. Kiang has been working on Hellenistic sculpture and terracottas with special reference to the School of Alexandria. He has just had a great disappointment in that the Egyptian government will not grant him a visa to visit Egypt. I hope that the trip to ^{Rhodes} ~~Egypt~~ will make him forget this trouble.

Thank you very much indeed for facilitating the work done for me by Professor Wallace and his family, and in particular for your kindness to the Wallaces and the Stillwells. The rubbings and photos brought to me by the Wallaces have been of the greatest use. I enclose a summary list from the Soleil depot of the names on the jars, of which up to now I have records. You will see that nearly all are dated in the term of the eponym ΠΑΥΣΑΝΙΑΣ, and that in several cases he is called ΠΑΥΣΑΝΙΑΣ Ο ΤΕΛΕΣΣΟΝΟΣ - I assume that it is the same man as on the other jars. One jar names instead the eponym ΕΥΚΑΗΣ, whom we know from other evidence to be about contemporary with this ΠΑΥΣΑΝΙΑΣ. (no. 6) The stamps on the tops of the handles of this jar do not name a month. I would like very much to know whether there is another stamp, on the side of one of the handles of no. 6, which names a month. At present I believe the date of this ΠΑΥΣΑΝΙΑΣ to be toward the end of the first quarter of the 3rd century B.C.



Above is a summary list of the names on the jars from the Soleil Hotel extension excavation of the summer of 1960, so far as I have records of them at present.

Note that these bear endorsements by four different persons, and are nearly all dated in a single term, that of the eponym ΠΑΥΣΑΝΙΑΣ; in several cases the eponym's name is given as ΠΑΥΣΑΝΙΑΣ Ο ΤΕΛΕΣΣΩΝΟΣ, but I am guessing he is the same man. One jar names, instead, the eponym ΕΥΚΛΗΣ, whom we know from other evidence to be contemporary with this ΠΑΥΣΑΝΙΑΣ. Nearly all are dated in the month ΥΑΚΙΝΘΙΟΣ; ΑΡΡΙΑΝΙΟΣ named on no. 29 immediately precedes ΥΑΚΙΝΘΙΟΣ in Nilsson's hypothetical Rhodian calendar (Timbres amphoriques de Lindos, p. 132, and cf. p. 126).

This precedes Αρρητιος, Nilsson p. 132.

This is evidently a purchase, or possibly some kind of requisition, in any case the opposite to the material from the Villanova deposit (Annuario IV-V, pp. 249-269). This latter is an accumulation of jars dated during many different months through eight eponym terms, the produce essentially of two potters one of whom evidently succeeded the other, since, while we know them to be roughly contemporary with one another, there is no overlap of eponym terms between them. I.e. the Villanova deposit seems to be made up of factory discards or surplus.

24. VII. 61 But what about the non-Rhodian? (Thasos, Kos, etc.)

Date of the Soleil jars: at least three eponyms ΠΑΥΣΑΝΙΑΣ are known. The shapes of the jars of the Soleil group, and the associated fabricant names, identify Π. Ο ΤΕΛΕΣΣΩΝΟΣ with the one datable in the first quarter of the 3rd century by Agora context, see especially N 10 : 2 (in E). I should guess, latish in this quarter.


