My dear Carol,

The stamped amphora handle I gave you was found on a Sunday (June 17, 1990) in Stamata of Attica, very near Ekali (the place is called Amygialeza or Mygdaleza).

I was following the directions of John Travlos' "Bildlexikon zur Topographie des Antiken Attika" (CI 16/10 Reserve shelf) p.85 below and p.86. I was looking for the Christian Basilica and I was told by a nun (there is a convent nearby) that the church I was looking for was found in a Greek rich man's property (we can find out what his name is, if you need it). So, since I couldn't approach to the basilica (the rich man's private property was fenced all around, of course) I tried to get as close, as I could but from outside the fence, that is from a ploughed field next to the private property. I saw the amphora handle right there, lying on top soil. Unfortunately I cannot tell you right now whether the field is to the N, S, E or W of the basilica. I didn't notice.

I first showed it to Mr. Williams, who said that he couldn't think of a parallel and that it might prove to be a rare piece.

He suggested that I should give it to the School's sherd collection. So I did

having first taken 4 pictures of it. Miss Grace or Carolyn Kochler may be able to give us more details.

Note that in Travlos' Bildlexikon

is mentioned, that the church may be indicative of an earlier settlement in the area, which may have been the center of the ancient deme Plotheia.

Attached is a rubbing of an Early Rhodian handle picked up by Charles K.

Williams while exploring at Hermione with M. Jameson in August 1961. At the same place was found a Ptolemaic bronze coin which, J. McCredie informs me, is of the same kind as those found at Porto Raphiti, type attributed by Svoronos to Ptolemy II.

The rubbing does not give quite an adequate impression of the stamp, because the surface of the handle has partly peeled away. Reading:

This stamp is not exactly duplicated in our files, though there are several examples (found in Rhodes and in Alexandria) of another type naming ΑΓΡΙΟΣ as priest.

The eponym's name appears on the handle of a large jar-fragment from Porto Raphiti (PR 79), also on a published handle found in late 4th century B.C. context on the Pnyx (Hesperia, Suppl. X, p.141, no.70).

The shape of the Hermione handle - broadish, short-topped, and without much arch - corresponds with that of handles on the group of Rhodian jars considered to date before 300 B.C., the best context evidence being that of H.A.T. above cited. The relative heaviness of the Hermione handle, and its "normal" Rhodian clay, indicate the jar was of the "normal" shape among the three general types in use in Rhodes at this time, i.e. the shape which later gradually developed into that for instance of Hesperia 1934, p.202, fig.5 (SS 370, from HAT Group B), and still later to the better-known Rhodian jars such as Hesperia 1953, pl.42, II.

EARLY RHODIAN STAMPED HANDLE FROM KEA FOUND VII.61 BY R. STROUD

In July, 1961, R. Stroud picked up an early Rhodian handle from the surface near Korissia, Kea.

Reading: ΠΑΡΑΠΑ
ΥΣΑΝΙΑ

Other examples of this stamp, i.e. with the same reading, line-break and letter-forms, have been found in Alexandria, Corinth (CP 1731), Rhodes (Dontas excavations), Samos (Heraion inventory), Bulgaria (see M. Mircev, Amphora Stamps in the Museum of Varna, Sofia, 1958, pl.XX, 6), and at Porto Raphti (PR 46).

A variation with lunate sigma is also known from Alexandria.

The preposition para is known in amphora stamps only with the names of the early Rhodian fabricants ΒΟΙΣΚΟΣ, ΕΥΦΡΩΝ and ΠΑΥΣΑΝΙΑΣ. Both of the first two are known on fragments which name also the eponym ΑΓΡΙΟΣ. For the combination ΕΥΦΡΩΝ - ΑΓΡΙΟΣ see Hesperia, Suppl. X, p.141 under no. 70, a handle from Pnyx context dated by H. A. T. in the late 4th century B.C. (packing of the City Wall). The name of the eponym ΑΓΡΙΟΣ has been read on a handle from Porto Raphti (PR 79).

The shape of the Kea handle - broadish, short-topped, and without much arch - corresponds with that of handles on the group of Rhodian jars considered to date before 300 B.C., the best context evidence being that of H. A. T. above cited.

The relative heaviness of the Kea handle, and its "normal" Rhodian clay, indicate the jar was of the κύρια "normal" shape among the three general types in use in Rhodes at this time, i.e. the shape which gradually developed into that for instance of Hesperia 1934, p. 202, fig.5 (SS 370, from HAT Group B), and later to the more common jars such as Hesperia 1953, pl. 42, II.



NOTES ON JAR FRAGMENTS FROM PRASIAI

A selection of jar fragments, stamped and unstamped, has been shown me by A Steinberg and J. McCredie, whb, with M. Jones as architect, have been making a study of the site of this Attic town on the cape forming the south shore of the bay of Porto Raphiti (cf. Baedeker, Greece, 1909, p.121). The following notes cover also a stamped Thasian handle found on the site by Mrs. Bandi.

There are altogether 4 stamped handles, of which 2 are Thasian (a and b), and two of uncertain origin, perhaps early Rhodian (c and d).

a) ΘΑΣΙΩΝ
dolphin
[Δ]ΗΜΑΛΚΗΣ

Example of the type of Bon, Les Timbres Amphoriques de Thasos, no.591. One more example is known, from Abdera, beside the one listed by Bon.

The types of ΔΗΜΑΛΚΗΣ, of which 6 are known, are not directly dated by any context of discovery, but comparative studies, chiefly of the devices shown in his stamps, suggest a date toward 300 B.C.

The types of ΕΥΑΓΟΡΑΣ, of which 7 are now on file with us, again are not dated directly by excavation context, but showing a wine-amphora; the shapes represented in the two are very close to each other, and seem to mean to depict the Thasian amphora of toward 300 B.C., with its relatively long handles, full rounded body, and short stem above the tip.

We have not been able to identify any known type in what is preserved of this stamp. The shape of the handle and section of rim preserved suggest it may be early Rhodian, i.e. of the late 4th century B.C. If so, possibly restore: [ΑΓΚ]ΙC though the C may be a round epsilon. [ΙΚ]Η (c)

Note that just a vestige of the Α is preserved, not a certain reading. (retr.)
ΑΓΧΕΙΚΑΛΗΣ is named in similarly formed stamps on early Rhodian handles.

ASP.075?d) We have not been able to decipher the combination of letters incompletely preserved in this stamp. Monogram stamps do occur on early Rhodian handles, and the fabric of (d) is much like that of (c), (no rim preserved, however), so possibly (d) is early Rhodian.

The stamped handles, then, suggest a date of ca. late 4th century B.C. Some unstamped handle and rim fragments also shown me from Prasiai could be about the

same date. These include mushroom (down-turned) rims not encroaching on the handle, and rolled rims against which the handle was plastered, as in "Coreyrean" jars of probably late 4th to early 3rd century B.C. Two amphora toes look much like one (uncatalogued) from a deposit of the ~~last quarter~~^{late} of the 4th century at the Athenian Agora (the blind passage from the south chamber of Thompson's Group B cistern system, see Hesperia, III, 1934, pp.331 and 332).

Mrs. Bandi's Thasian handle is (a) in the list above, and will be retained by her. The rest of the fragments will be kept in the collection of the ASCS.

Corinthian sequence

E.V. a couple of weeks ago brought some fragments
of necks and rims from Amphipolis Argos which
turn out to be Corinth, probably of the 5th (not early)
and 4th cent. B.C. I., they fall between our
4 catalogued pre-Persian necks (P 23373-4, P 15912, P 11065
— ^{begin} this seems to show a slight development) and our
early 3rd cent. necks, P 5528 and P 5525 (= early 3rd
cent. dep. at 63/NS). (One of them had a rim a good
deal like that of C 40-404, fair from 4th cent. wall; the
others were probably well earlier — flatter rims.)

Note interesting diff. in rims of P 5528 & P 5525;
like difference between Berlin of that period (a mustache and
a bandorn).




