of Topçis is in the museum in Konya, and I know  
a note of VT. 80 (but you showed me photos of jar and  
stamps; one of the pictures of the jar was in color, and  
was returned to you, by request).

We have read the epigraph as Aixivias. Did  
you have a different reading? I have no  
measurements. Have you any? Or rubbing of the  
stamps? Have you by any chance published this  
amphora? I would be glad to mention its  
existence in my notes for the stamped handles from  
Beersheba.

I look forward very much to your publication of  
new amphoras in Paphos.

P.S. To my note of yesterday:

Prints you have given me of jars in Kanya Museum

Amphora & Tropis (Pl.)

L 4647 74 Shows top of handle, and part  
of rim, which is broken and part missing.

Tropis can be read easily in stamp

L 4647 86 Shows top of the other handle  
and part of rim with the same break.

We have a reading for this stamp:

Eti Aixixa

'Yakivdisu'

The photograph does not exclude this  
reading, but it is not good, and it seems  
unlikely that we got the reading from the  
photograph alone. We find no markings.

L 4647 52 Side view of amphora, perhaps  
the same amphora, of Gorgias. We need  
height of amphora.

John Hayes gave me information in 1962 from which we made the above restoration of readings, reporting a Knidian jar in the Konges Museer. This is probably the jar of which a photo L 4647.78. (No photo of stamps.) The shape of the jar in your photo goes OK with the date of Κλεορβητος, IVB, like the latest <sup>Knidian</sup> jar illustrated in the Middle Sto article, Pl. 3, no. 15.

We need: height measurement of amphora, also some confirmation that your photo <sup>is</sup> of the jar of Εάρδος.


