Marzameni G. You say in your note that the amphoras "obviously include a good number of Cnidian"; but in the drawings one recognizes only no. 53 (top) and 45 (toe) as of this class. These look ma. mid 2nd. Perhaps the same period, the Italian piece no. 59: cf. Amphoras, fig. 31, jar to right (its r. handle is wrongly restored). Your no. 35 may be Rhodian, if the tilt is wrong in the restored drawing - the neck should not taper downward. In Amph., fig. 31, the jar to the left is a Rhodian of about the same date as the Italian jar to the right. No. 37 is I suppose a Punic or Phoenician.

Having to EK jar from Naxos to study ~~it~~
 - where it fits, I have mounted it, partly with
 photo. which had been clipped on to an old mounting,
 and partly assembling ^{others} ~~the~~ ones. 13. VII. 83 This is pretty
 close to Hellenistic Wreath Amphora 4. (N & E) Probably from the
 same? And not Knidian?

In EK, we have the 2 more or less fixed
 points, which acc. to current "blue" dating, are
 ca. (241) for SS 371 from Group B and ca. (205)
 for the Grand Longone jar (because of its accompanying
 Rhodian dated in terms of Kd. eutropaeos).

I have put the Knidian jar and the Naxos
 jar between these. But I do not clearly see
 a pattern.

Also the Gr. Long. jar looks a good deal
 separated from SS 7542 (cf. N. Karas/Boudos C)
 which ^{may} must be earlier than the jar dated by
 A. D. (Coxos) (183 B.C.). This could suggest that
 the end of the MSBF (cf. A. D. (Coxos) common to them)
 should be dated later.

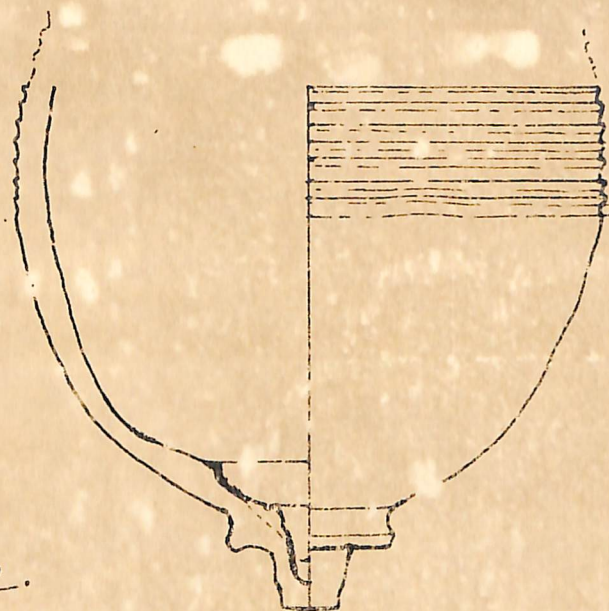

 for GRE 527 (C. 251, C. 48-9), which has been
 considered 166-146, but now I think it belongs
 with this bundle ~~at~~ close to the start of 188-166
 (because of numerous connections with types ranging both
 ep. and pp.) (see notes of 24.IV.62):

C. 48-9, of Ἀποδοδεύς
 GRE 527 preserves whole top of jar, and the
 handle ~~ht~~ is given as 0.264. To be checked, but
 it looks as if the handles are longer in the 188-167
 period than before (MSBP jars) or after - of jar
 of Ἀποδοδεύς ep. Ἀποδοδεύς.

Note big change between this latter jar and
 3/4 2nd - Ἀποδοδεύς of Ἀποδοδεύς.

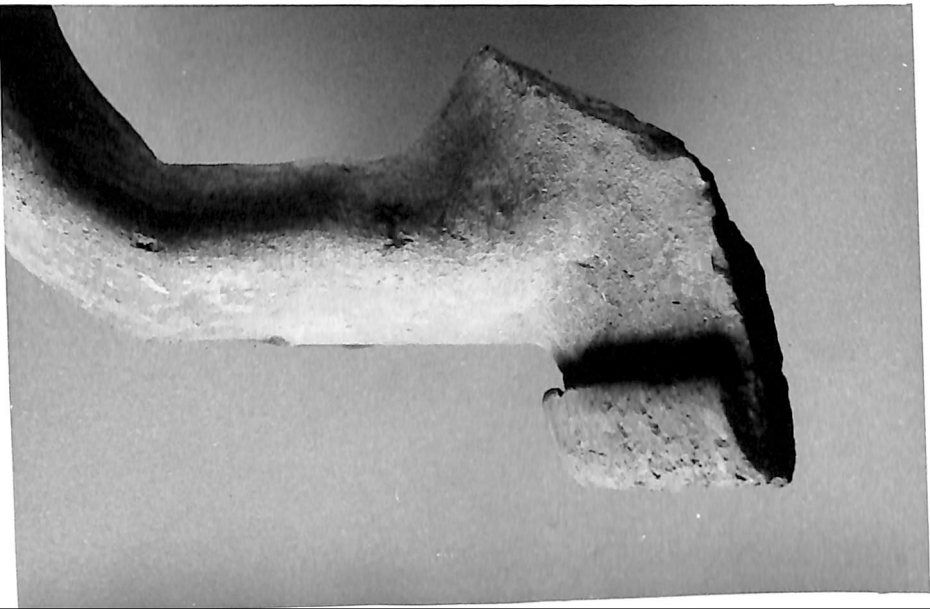

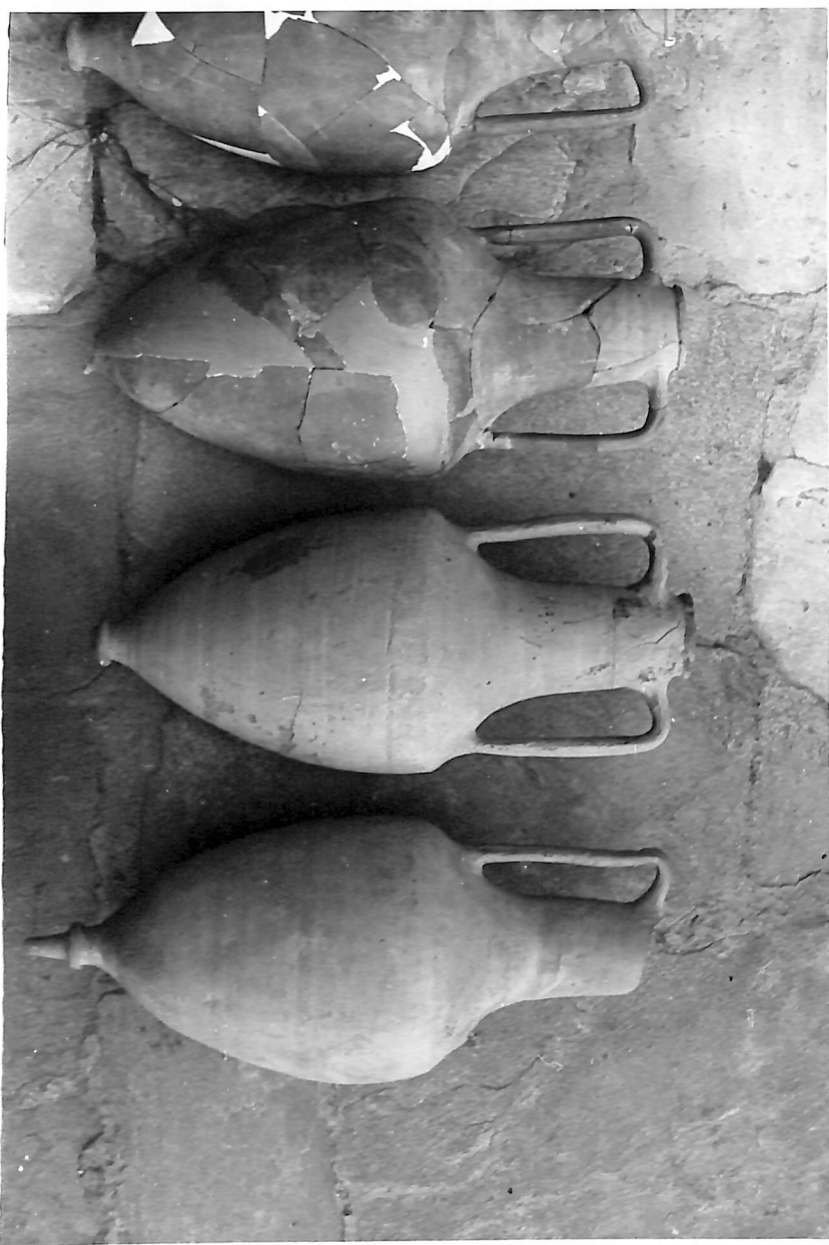
