The stamps of Kos, found in the number of 14, are applied only to double-barrelled handles. Coarse stamps on one-barreled thin handles mentioned by Shtaerman, [2] are not found in Phan. All the Kos stamps are either rectangular or oval and have only one word - a name in full or abbreviated (ΔΑΔΑΙΟΣ, ΜΕΝΕΚΡΑΤΗΣ, ΠΑΟΥΤΑΡΧΟΣ, ΗΡΑΙ, ΔΕΥΚΟΣ, ΟΡΟΒΙΩΝΟΣ, ΖΩΤΙΚΟΣ and others), sometimes with an added device. Only in one round stamp on double-barrelled handle there is a monogram ~~of~~^{✓ (not exactly the same in Grakov's list)}, the deciphering of which is difficult (another Kos stamp with a monogram was found in Pantik.).



On her return several days ago, Martha told us she had found no Coan. She was not able to go through the storerooms in Jerusalem, and very likely there are other examples in addition to those known to us from 'Ayn Hafir. But she examined a good many bronzes from Byblos, some at the site and some at the museum in Beirut without seeing any Coan; furthermore M. Seyrig told her she had not seen any in Syria at all.




PLATE L Hel Pottery and Iron Sword

light brown in colour with white slip all over the surface. The height is 11.2 cm and the diameter of the body 6.0 cm.

The last one coming from the Hellenistic stratum of S 20 has a remarkably emphasized shoulder with a cylindrical neck slightly bent inside and a thick mouth. The outside bottom has a kick. It is well fired, yellowish brown in colour with white slip all over and dark red decorative bands, one at the shoulder and two on the body. The height is 12.5 cm, the diameter of the body 9.0 cm.

Lamps Of the three lamps unearthed, two came out of the same pit and have almost the same shape common to all Hellenistic lamps, i.e. a round body with a long wick mouth and a circular line sunk into the shoulder. Both are well fired and light yellowish brown. Both also have a slightly kicked bottom. The one is 3.6 cm high and 8.2 cm long (Plate L 2), the other 3.4 cm high and 8.4 cm long.

The third lamp, compared with the two mentioned above, is different both in form and colour and is unique in that it has a decoration on the shoulder and the upper surface of the wick mouth, which is large-sized and continuous with the body. The decoration is carved out with a matrix, the main figure of which is a bearded face — maybe an image of Zeus — placed on the joint between the wick mouth and the shoulder. The lamp is well fired, dark brown and has a little lustre (Plate L 1).

Handle of a Jar made on Kos Island This is a handle of a jar consisting of two jointed cylindrical parts and connected with the rim of the mouth. On this there is a Greek inscription which can be deciphered as ASKLÉPI [....] (Plate L 4). *add : [club] below*

Glass Wares

Glass Flask with a long Neck It is an extremely thin vessel with a flat-globular body and a pointed, long neck. The bottom has a kick. Made of a slightly yellowish transparent glass, the surface has become silvery. A part of the rim of the mouth and of the lower body and bottom are lacking. Present length 11.6 cm, the diameter of the body 7.2 cm.

6. Summary

The main object of investigation during this season, i.e. the Iron Age strata in R and S trenches, proved to be disturbed by the following two factors.

The first is the disturbance caused in later periods. Namely, the Iron Age strata were destroyed to a considerable degree by the digging of pits during the Persian Period or the construction of Arabic tombs in the Middle Ages, so that stone walls were damaged and the stones reused.

Secondly, there is some evidence which indicates the occurrence of a cave-in. In the previous season, it was already made clear that the uppermost Iron Age stratum (Stratum VI) showed signs of repeated disasters and accumulation of fallen bricks, earth and sand. The like situation could be observed also during the second season 1965. Especially noticeable is the accumulation of ashes in several layers, of which some are about 2 cm thick and others surpassing 10 cm. On the division wall between R and S trenches, ash lines mark large arcs, and in S trench they decline from east to west (Plate III below). Inclined are not only ash lines, but also the remains of constructions like the stone foundation of brick walls or stone floors. In the case of the red sun-dried brick wall in R 18, not only inclination, but clear traces of cave-in can
