Preliminary Report on Roman Amphoras in the Eastern Mediterranean

The plain pointed amphoras customarily referred to as "Roman" were manufactured, like their Greek counterparts, as commercial containers for oil, wine, and other products. In general, Roman amphoras are both larger and more coarsely made than the Greek jars; they have a more pronounced rim or collar; and they regularly bear a stamp in Latin letters, impressed on the rim or the handle or sometimes on other parts of the jar. Present evidence indicates that these jars originated in southern Italy and, particularly during the Empire, in Spain and perhaps also in other areas. Whatever their origins, Roman amphoras, usually in fragmentary form, are found in abundance on most Roman sites. They lie in vast numbers beneath the sea as well; in fact the growth of submarine archaeology in recent years has focused wide attention on these jars, which are among the most important of the finds revealed by underwater research. Roman amphoras are found on land and in the sea in such numbers that the task of collecting the jars and fragments, classifying them, and interpreting the evidence has by its magnitude discouraged adequate scholarship. As a result, the interest aroused by Roman amphoras has in the past confined itself to studies of the stamps alone or to descriptions of the jars found at individual sites, with little attention paid to their relationship to jars found at other sites. In other words, the vastness of the evidence has hindered comparative study of a sort which would establish the chief types of amphoras, construct a chronology for them, and pave the way for conclusions not alone about the history of the jars themselves but also about the quantity and extent of trade in wine and oil, the chief products which these jars contained, and among the most important objects of trade in the Roman world.

Roman amphoras, then, since they provide tangible and almost indestructible evidence of trade during Roman times in two staples of agricultural production, should be of interest to the economic historian as well as to the archaeologist. They and the stamps they bear should help to clarify such historical matters as the amount of trade in these products at various periods among the great commercial centers, the parts of the Roman world which led in the production of oil and wine, and the individuals who controlled the production and distribution. In throwing light on these questions, Roman amphoras should give us more precise knowledge than we now possess about the general pattern of Roman commerce; for, oil and wine being two of the chief objects of ancient trade, the history of trade in them during the Roman period should parallel the history of trade in general during that period. We should expect to find the largest numbers of wine and oil jars at those sites which were the chief commercial centers, and we should expect the largest numbers of those jars to date from periods when trade was at its height.

For the present, the study of Roman amphoras must continue to be confined to limited geographical areas. Only thus can sufficiently detailed material be assembled to make possible a thorough comparative study. The renewed interest in the subject indicates that more comprehensive work may soon be possible.

The report which follows is a preliminary study of the Roman amphoras found so far at four major Roman centers in the Eastern Mediterranean: Athens, Corinth, and Delos, in the Aegean area; and, farther south, Alexandria. At this time, it is possible to determine with certainty the types and in most cases the dates of approximately half of the 1349⁶⁶ whole jars and fragments from these four sites, and to determine with probability the types and dates of the majority of the remainder. This survey summarizes the

probable chronology of these jars and seeks to establish the chief types to which they belong. A later article, in addition to including any new information which further study may reveal about these topics, will publish the Latin amphora stamps from the four sites and will present evidence, derived primarily from the stamps, relating to the origin, manufacture, distribution, and contents of the jars.

Before proceeding to the discussion of dates and types, it will be of interest to cite some general facts and figures about the collections under consideration. Of the ¹³⁶⁶1349 Roman amphoras and fragments recorded so far at the four sites, ⁵¹²511 (well over one-third of the total) have been discovered at Delos, ⁴³⁰422 at Alexandria, ³⁶⁷361 at Athens, and ⁵⁷55 at Corinth. The finds from Delos and Corinth are housed in the museums at those sites. The material from Athens belongs to three separate collections: ²⁶²260 jars and fragments have been discovered at the Agora Excavations, ⁹⁴90 have found their way to the National Museum, and 11 are at the Kerameikos Museum. Of the objects from Alexandria, ⁴⁰²392 are in the extensive private collection of Mr. L. A. Benachi, 18 are in the Alexandria Museum (where an additional number, amounting perhaps to several hundreds, awaits study), and 12 are part of the Rostovitch Collection, now in the National Museum at Athens.

Although the collections of Roman amphoras at Delos and at Alexandria surpass it in size, the group of jars and fragments at Athens, and in particular at the Agora Excavations, furnishes the basis for the present study. Agora contexts, primarily dated wells and cisterns, are the source of most of the definite dates, and provide the widest range of dates, covering over five centuries, from the early third century B.C. to the early ^{or mid-}third century A.D.; and the presence of a large number of unbroken, and nearly whole, jars at the Agora has been the chief means of distinguishing at this stage twenty-two types of jars. Athens furnishes the framework and many of the details,

but the other sites are of great importance in enriching the picture. The collection of Roman amphoras at Delos, noteworthy because of its size and because of the variety and fine preservation of the amphora stamps, is valuable also in that it consists of a large amount of material from the fairly limited period of Roman interest in the island. For Corinth, too, the periods of Roman commercial activity can be delimited, at least in part, by the dates of the destruction and rebuilding of that city; and, in addition, some of the objects from Corinth come from dated contexts. With respect to Alexandria, finally, the importance of the material from that site rests not merely upon its being potentially the largest group of Roman amphora remains in the eastern Mediterranean; for, in addition, almost two-thirds (64%) of the material from Alexandria belongs to one distinct type of jar (Type 11, below). The abundance of information from Alexandria about this type, buttressed by further information from Delos and Athens, offers an unusual opportunity for reconstructing in some detail the history of a particular type of jar.

The following chronological section is based on a system of dating which requires explanation. The dates are classified as "definite," "probable," "possible," and "uncertain." Definite dates have been assigned to objects found in dated contexts of consistent character or to objects which on the basis of distinctive shape or stamp belong to types of jars of which other examples have been found in dated contexts. Probable dates have been assigned to objects possessing characteristics similar to, but not certainly identical with, those of definitely dated types. It should be noted that the largest number of jars and fragments with probable dates comes from Delos, and most of the remainder are from Corinth. Our knowledge about the periods of commercial activity at both sites renders the probable dates more sure, but it should be repeated that probable dates have been assigned

generally only on the basis of shape, although sometimes other characteristics, such as types of stamps or methods of stamping, or even forms of letters, have been taken into consideration. Possible dates have been given to objects which have less in common with dated types than have those with probable dates but about which enough is known to prevent their classification as of uncertain date. Lastly, uncertain dates have been assigned to fragments of unknown or uncertain type, including some 89 fragments at Delos, or identical with fragments at Delos, about the types of which nothing can at present be surmised, although the connection with Delos perhaps justifies a date in the late second or early first centuries B.C.

No dates more exact than early, middle, and late have been attempted for each century. The catalogue of types at the end of the article shows that more exact dates, for a few types, are known, but these exact dates actually indicate as little as the "early-middle-late" dates, because the evolution of Roman amphoras seems in general to have been a slow one. The same type might remain in fashion for several decades. The dates given in this study, then, stand for the periods, sometimes long and sometimes short, during which a particular type of jar is known to have been in active commercial use.

Of the 1349 jars and fragments under discussion, 616 have been dated definitely, 408 probably, 78 possibly, and 247 are of uncertain date. The number definitely dated represents approximately 46% of the whole, and includes 68% of the material from Alexandria (most of it belonging to Type 11, which can be dated on the basis of Agora contexts) and 65% of that from the Agora Excavations. The figures for definitely dated material from the other collections in Athens, from Delos, and from Corinth are much lower: 21%, 25%, and 12% respectively. If we observe, however, the large proportion of probable dates, for the two latter sites in particular, we are clearly in a position at this stage to draw general conclusions about the chronology of

Roman amphoras found in the Aegean area and at Alexandria.

The chart accompanying this article (Figure 1) summarizes by periods for each of the sites, and for the area as a whole, the number of amphoras or fragments dated at present according to the methods explained above. The indications of the figures on the chart for the region in general may be summarized as follows:

The history of Roman amphoras in the eastern Mediterranean covers more than five centuries (early third century B.C. to early^{or mid-}third century A.D.). The use of these jars in the area was at its height during the late Republic, specifically the late second and early first centuries B.C. Their continued presence, in much smaller numbers, is indicated for the remainder of the first century B.C., a second peak in their use occurring in the Augustan Age. After this time, the only concentration of Roman amphoras is datable, roughly, to the middle of the second century A.D. As far as the individual sites are concerned, Delos, as was stated above, leads at present all the other sites in the number of its jars and fragments, the great majority of which are probably to be dated in the late second and early first centuries B.C. Most of the (potentially more extensive) material at Alexandria dates from the same period. The comparatively small group of fragments at Corinth has, it is likely, a chronological range second only to that of Athens, although probably the sole significant group of these objects should be dated in the middle and late first century B.C. Athens, finally, provides a wide range of material from most eras, the late second and early first centuries B.C. and the late first century B.C. to early first century A.D. being the two periods of particular importance.

Having presented a preliminary chronology of Roman amphoras in the eastern Mediterranean, we may look now to see how it compares with the accepted history of commerce in the area during the Roman period, and what if any elucidation of the subject it seems likely to provide. But it will be relevant,

first, to introduce here a summary of what is now known, or believed, to have been the course of Roman commercial activity at the four great emporia of Athens, Corinth, Delos, and Alexandria.

The appearance of Roman (more correctly, Italian) negotiatores on a large scale in the eastern Mediterranean postdates 166 B.C., when Delos became a free port. Before that time, evidence of western commercial activity in Greece and at Alexandria is slight. But after 166, more particularly after 146, when the destruction of Corinth and of Carthage deprived the Mediterranean of two of its greatest centers for trade, and especially after 133, when Asia became a province, the importance of Delos grew until the island became the center of trade between East and West and developed a prosperity which lasted until the second decade of the first century B.C. During that time, Italians were the dominant element of the Delian population, forming themselves into powerful trade associations for which evidence is to be found as early as 140 B.C. The prosperity of Delos after 166 overflowed into Athens, to which Delos had been given by Rome, and which also at this time enjoyed a revival of trade. A large colony of Italian merchants formed part of the Athenian population. As for Alexandria during this period, despite the internal disorder in Egypt during the second century B.C., there is evidence that trade was expanding. Italian merchants are known to have been in Alexandria from 127 B.C. on, but the city probably occupied a commercial position inferior to that of Delos.

The sack of Delos by Mithridates in 88 B.C., the slaughter by him of 80,000 Italians in Asia Minor in the same year, the pillaging of Athens and destruction of the Piraeus by Sulla in 86 B.C., the sack of Delos by the pirates in 69 B.C., and the decline of the slave trade: all were important in their effects on commerce in the area. Both Delos and Athens suffered severe economic setbacks, despite Roman efforts to restore prosperity to them. By

the middle of the first century B.C., trade at Delos had apparently ceased, and Athens, though better off than Delos, was hardly prosperous. While Roman commercial activity in the Aegean dwindled at this time, trade between Alexandria and the West after the decay of Delos probably grew. And the rebuilding of Corinth, after 44 B.C., provided Rome with a new Aegean market. During the reign of Augustus there is evidence of impressive Roman commercial activity at Alexandria, Corinth, and again at Athens, although Delos was no longer a trading center.

After Augustus, Roman trade at Athens declined, but it was maintained, at least during the early Empire, at Alexandria, now the chief commercial center in the eastern Mediterranean, and probably at Corinth, the trading center of Greece. With the decline of Alexandria and Corinth in the third century, evidence of active Roman economic interest in those emporia ceases.

Commercial activity implies both buying and selling. Until provincial competition captured the Italian market, the Roman traders in the East were engaged not only in buying the products of the Orient but also in selling the exports of Italy, among which wine and oil gradually developed a world-wide reputation. It is not surprising, then, to discover that the history of Roman amphoras at four prominent trading centers in the eastern Mediterranean appears to parallel the history of Roman commercial activity in the area. The known periods of particular prosperity for Roman trade in the East were the late second and early first centuries B.C., when Delos was at its height, and the late first century B.C. to early first century A.D., when commerce flourished under Augustus. We have pointed out that these are the periods to which a majority of the Roman amphoras and fragments found in the region of the Aegean and at Alexandria must be assigned. The dates of the rise and decline of Delos and the position of the island as a focus of Roman trade in the East during the late Republic are also confirmed by the amphoras, as is the rise of Corinth to

a renewed position of commercial importance after the middle of the first century B.C. The material from Athens confirms that city's economic importance to Rome and the West during the late Republic and the Augustan Age. Finally, the concentration of material at Alexandria reflects the significance of her commercial position during Roman times.

There are, thus, important and not unexpected parallels between the history of Roman commercial activity in the East and the probable history of Roman amphoras there. In view of these parallels, and despite the relative incompleteness of our knowledge at present, we are justified in looking for ways in which the history of Roman amphoras may be able to clarify what we know about commerce in the East during the Roman period.

With respect, first, to the duration of western interest in trading with the area, the presence at the Agora Excavations in Athens of a Roman jar belonging to the early third century B.C. and of three Roman jars or fragments datable to the early second century B.C. does not contradict the theory that active Roman trade in the East postdated the making of Delos a free port in 166 B.C. Evidence of sporadic commercial contact between East and West before 166 is given by other sources. We know, for example, that an Italian boat from Brindisi visited Andros in 250 B.C. At the other chronological extreme, however, the amphoras furnish little evidence of Roman, or rather of Italian, trading activity in the East after the age of Augustus. It is known, of course, that as the Empire wore on Rome became more interested in buying than in selling, but the virtual cessation of evidence for Italian amphoras in the East at so early a date is striking, though perhaps less so when we remember the growth of Puteoli and Ostia as trading centers with the East and in addition the importation of Italian vines into Egypt during the Empire, a practice which naturally lessened Alexandria's demand for native Italian wines. Interesting also is the concentration, though a small one, of Roman jars datable to

the middle of the second century A.D. and perhaps later. Amphoras of this type were long ago shown, by Dressel and others, to be almost entirely of Spanish origin. This is the type of jar (Type 20, below) of which abundant traces have been found on Monte Testaccio in Rome. Its presence in the East indicates that by the middle of the second century Spain had not only captured the Italian market in the West but had gone farther afield to take what was left of that market in the East itself.

The fact that 65% of the total number of Roman jars at the four sites probably belongs to what may be called the "Delian period," whereas only 6% of the total can at present be assigned to the Augustan Age, implies that the former period, and not the latter, was the heyday of Roman commercial activity in the East, a distinction about which our evidence from other sources is not explicit. We notice, also, that most of the jars datable to the age of Augustus have been found at Athens, and not at Alexandria or Corinth, raising the possibility that Athens was the chief eastern market in the late first century B.C. and early first century A.D. That she continued to surpass Corinth commercially during the remainder of the Roman period is also indicated by the amphoras; yet the prevalent theory maintains that Corinth was the entrepôt of the Aegean during the Empire. With regard to Alexandria, the introduction of Italian vines into Egypt may well account for the relatively small number of Roman amphoras, and most of them of Spanish origin, found at that city and dating from the time of the Empire. Of more interest is the striking concentration of late Republican jars at Alexandria, which may, when all the evidence is in, turn out to possess more remains of Roman amphoras than Delos. It is at least possible that Alexandria's commercial subordination to Delos during the late Republic was less great than has heretofore been thought. Another possible clarification of accepted economic history may result from the presence at Delos of a few Roman amphora fragments dating from the Augustan Age. The economic life

of Delos may not, then, have come to a final standstill in the middle of the first century B.C., but it may have been stimulated into brief life again by the prosperity at Athens during the closing years of the century.

Such are some of the possible ways in which a thorough chronological study of Roman amphoras in the East may throw light on more general aspects of the history of Roman trade. The establishment of a sound chronology for these jars will also be of use since it will provide one more link in a chain still far from complete: the history of Roman amphoras during all periods and in all parts of the Roman world. Such a history, if it is ever completed, will help fill a void in our knowledge of Roman pottery. It will also be of importance in archaeological field work, giving excavators a new criterion by which to date contexts. Most importantly, it should stimulate for Roman economic history in general what has been attempted in a preliminary way for Roman economic history in the East in this initial survey: a re-examination of the evidence in the light of the ceramic remains.

- - -

We have pointed out that the preceding chronological survey was based not only on objects found in dated contexts but also on those which could be assigned to distinct types, most of which are datable. Twenty-two types of amphoras are now known to occur at the four sites with which this study is concerned. A little less than half (666, or 49%) of the 1349 jars and fragments can be assigned to type, and the types of the majority of the rest can be determined with probability, although further study may augment the number of known types. We are able to conclude from the shapes and stamps peculiar to the various types that most of them are found elsewhere in the Roman world; that is, the Roman amphoras in the East are not a closed group. Many of them (notably Types 14 and 20) were identified long ago. Other types (for example,

Types 10, 11, and 13) are not known to have been satisfactorily identified heretofore; yet Types 10 and 11 occur more frequently than any others in the East, and published lists of stamps show that they are to be found in many other parts of the Mediterranean world.

Basic to a thorough establishment of types is the existence of whole, unbroken amphoras. This is true in the identification of jars with types already published elsewhere, and it is especially true for the identification of unpublished categories. Of the twenty-two types known to occur in the East, twelve are represented by whole jars found in the area. Of the 103 whole jars, 85, representing ten types, are from the Agora Excavations (67 of them belong to Type 10), and 18, representing four types (two of them also at the Agora) are from Delos. Fragments of the ten types not represented by whole jars are, in every case but one, sufficiently large to permit their probable identification with types already established in published accounts or with types of which whole, but unpublished, examples are known to exist.

The following catalogue describes in their probable chronological order the twenty-two types of Roman amphoras identified so far at Athens, Corinth, Delos, and Alexandria. It should be stated clearly at the beginning that, while the plates (numbers 1-4) in general illustrate only one example of each type, the jars belonging to any one type are usually capable of several variations in the shapes of rims, handles, and other parts, although the proportions and characteristic features of the type tend to remain constant.

TYPE 1. Early third century B.C. Plate 1. The jar illustrated, Agora P.14180, the only example of this type at the four sites, is from Section Ω , well at 67/ $\Lambda\Gamma$, lower fill. Preserved height, 0.71; diameter, 0.40. A small jar, whole except for toe and fragments of shoulder and belly. Unstamped. Very narrow rim, flaring out strongly from top to bottom and joining neck with sloping attachment. Handles of medium width, oval in section, far from neck,

drooping at top, and sloping out toward bottom. Neck narrower at center than at top and bottom. Shoulder slopes downward strongly. Belly considerably wider at top than at bottom. Micaceous orange-buff clay with many small bits and no apparent surfacing.

Similar rims, from Tindari in Sicily, are dated circa 320 B.C. to circa 200 B.C. by N. Lamboglia, "La Nave Romana di Albenga," Rivista di Studi Liguri, XVIII, (1952), p. 162, fig. 20.

TYPE 2. Early second century B.C. Plate 1. There are two examples of this type, both of them whole jars and at the Agora. Both are unstamped. Illustrated is P 6761, from Section B', well 9. Height, 0.575; diameter, 0.23. A very small jar, entire except for pieces of toe and rim. Narrow rim of small diameter and sloping out sharply from top to bottom. Handles narrow and oval in section, sloping up slightly at upper attachment and inclining in toward neck. Neck narrower at top than at bottom. Shoulder scarcely separated from neck. Rather long belly, slanting inward to toe at bottom. Micaceous pale pinkish-buff clay; apparently no surfacing; some reddish bits visible.

TYPE 3. Middle of the second century B.C. (?) Plate 1. There are five examples of this type, all fragmentary: two handles at the Agora, a neck at Corinth, and two handles at Delos. All of the examples are stamped. Illustrated is Corinth C-47-80, from Well XXX of the South Stoa. Preserved height, 0.333; diameter of rim, 0.135. Neck, with rim and both handles entire. The same stamp, C.CAR. (Plate 4, number 1), is set lengthwise on both handles midway between the two attachments. Rim very narrow and flaring out sharply from top to bottom. Handles squarish at top, thin ovals in section, medium in length. Neck widens at top and bottom. This jar-type probably is known from Numantia, where the shoulder is sharply defined and the belly long and narrow, sloping gradually to a thick toe. See C. Koenen, Keramik von Numantia, in A. Schulten, Numantia, IV (1929), Die Lager bei Rerieblas, Table 73.

Buff clay, finely micaceous; dark deposit on surface; heavy fabric. First published by O. Broneer, Hesperia, XVI, (1947), p. 240 and plate LVII, 9.

TYPE 4. Late second and early first centuries B.C. Plate 1. Ten examples of this type are known: four nearly whole jars and three very large fragments of jars at the Agora, and three whole jars at Delos. Two of the ten examples are stamped, on the rim. Chosen for illustration are two cases which represent possible stages in the development of the type. The first jar ("a" on the plate) is Agora P 8106, one of four similar jars from Section $\Pi\theta$, cistern at 6/NE, a context of the late second century B.C. Height, 1.055; diameter, 0.302. A tall, slim jar, entire except for most of one handle. Unstamped. Rim flaring out from top to bottom. Handles very long, widish, slightly ribbed, and close to neck; thick oval in section. Neck very long and nearly cylindrical. Sloping shoulder. Long, narrow belly. Short, thick toe. Micaceous pale orange clay; rather coarse, with many tiny black and white bits; no surfacing. The second jar illustrated ("b" on the plate) is Agora SS 6814, from Section X, cistern at 75/OA, middle fill, a context of the early first century B.C. Preserved height, 0.625. The upper half of the jar is preserved, partly restored in plaster. A stamp on the rim (Plate 4, number 2) appears to be a ligature of A and T. The jar is similar to P 8106, except for the rim, which is nearly vertical in profile. Micaceous buff clay.

It would be misleading to attempt to make precise statements at this time about the evolution of Type 4. The three jars found in the same context with P 8106, and contemporary with it, have rims that are identical, or nearly so, but these jars vary with respect to length and curvature of handles, distance of handles from necks, and definition of shoulder angles. We may conclude, then, that slight variations in the forms of handles and shoulders are risky criteria for dating. The possibility that rim profiles in this type of jar sloped outward from top to bottom in the earlier examples and were regularly

vertical in the later ones, and that therefore P 8106 and SS 6814 represent two stages in the evolution of the type, is no more than a possibility. It is very likely that vertical rims were not fashionable before the first century B.C., but in Type 10 outsloping rims were contemporary with vertical rims in the early first century B.C., so were probably replaced by vertical rims only gradually.

Jars very similar to Type 4 in profile and in dimensions have been found in or near the wreck of an ancient ship in the sea off Marseilles. See, for example, F. Benoit, "L'archéologie sous-marine en Provence," Rivista di Studi Liguri, XVIII, (1952), 244-255. A date in the early second century B.C. has been proposed for the boat, but it is difficult to see how the amphoras, if they were indeed part of the boat's cargo, can be given so early a date. Several amphora fragments bearing stamps similar to those found on the Marseilles jars and belonging to the same type of jar have been found at Cosa, two of them in a context to which a date of c. 110-100 - - c. 40-30 B.C. has been given by Doris Taylor, in a forthcoming study of several pottery groups at Cosa.

Lamboglia (op. cit., Appendix, pp. 213-236) discusses jars similar to Type 4 and discovered in the sea along the Italian Riviera. The dates he assigns to these jars range from the early second century to the early first century B.C. His criteria for dating are the variations of the shapes and their presumed evolution, a fact which opens many of the earliest dates to question. The jars to which the earliest dates are assigned have rims which slope out from top to bottom. They do not appear to vary more from one another than do the jars found at the Agora associated with P 8106. A date toward the end of the second century B.C. is probably safe for them.

Lamboglia's main subject in the article referred to is the very large group of amphoras found in the wreckage of an ancient ship in the sea off

Albenga. The consistently vertical rims and angular lines of these jars set them apart from the Riviera jars with diagonal rims, as Lamboglia points out, and probably justify a date later than the late second century B.C. for them. The Albenga amphoras, for which no exact equivalent is known to have been found in the East, may very well be a development of Type 4. Unquestionably, as Lamboglia again points out, they belong to Dressel's Type 1 (CIL, XV), long thought to have been the earliest type of stamped Roman amphora, and on which Dressel found painted inscriptions naming consuls of as early as 102 B.C. and as late as 13 B.C., although it is likely that Dressel did not distinguish between any earlier and later forms of this jar.

Other apparent examples of amphoras of Type 4 have been found throughout Rome's western provinces. The Roman amphoras from Azaila in Spain include at least one example of Type 4 (Juan Cabré Aguiló, Corpus Vasorum Hispanorum, Madrid, 1944, plate 60, 12). This type of jar was found in both the lower and the upper Iberian levels at Azaila, levels to which dates of 134? - 77? B.C. and 77? - 43? B.C. respectively have been assigned. The weight to be given to these dates, as far as the amphoras at Azaila are concerned, is at best questionable, for both the proveniences and the types of jars, as described, are confused.

Impressive numbers of sites in Gaul and in Germany have produced examples of jars similar either to Type 4 or to Dressel's Type 1. Little exact information on contexts being, apparently, available, dates have been assigned to these jars on the bases of presumed evolution of shape and the probable histories of the sites at which the jars were found. On no stronger grounds, Loeschcke, in his important study of the amphoras from Oberaden (in Christoph Albrecht, Das Römerlager in Oberaden (Veröffentlichungen aus dem Städt. Museum für Vor- und Frühgeschichte Dortmund, II), Part 2: Die römische und die belgische Keramik, Dortmund, 1942), in his discussion of Type 77, assigns dates in the latter first century B.C. to Dressel's Type 1 and dates in the early part of the same century

to jars like Type 4. Bohn ("Die ältesten römischen Amphoren in Gallien," Germania, VII, (1923), 8-16), who does not seem to distinguish between the two jar types, would push the earliest date of their occurrence in Gaul back to the last quarter of the second century B.C. Bohn is followed by Grenier (Archéologie gallo-romaine, II, p. 635 (Déchelette, Manuel d'Archéologie préhistorique, celtique et gallo-romaine, VI, Paris, 1934), but his conclusions are questioned by Oxé ("Die ältesten römischen Amphoren am Rhein und in Gallien," Germania, VIII, (1924), 80-82), who feels that the resistance of amphoras, their longevity, makes it uncertain that they were brought to Gaul when they were new.

TYPE 5. Late second and early first centuries B.C. (?) Plate 1. Eight examples of this type are known in the eastern Mediterranean, all of them at Delos: seven nearly whole jars, all of which have lost their rims, and a large neck fragment, the only example with a stamp. Illustrated is . Height, ; diameter, . A very tall, slim jar, entire except for the rim and one handle. The rim, reconstructed on the basis of at least eight examples of this type of jar at Azaila (Cabré, op. cit., plate 60, 4-11), was probably very wide, narrow in diameter, and sloping out slightly from top to bottom in profile. Very long handle, thick oval in section, strongly curved and heavily ribbed. Neck correspondingly long, widening slightly toward bottom. Rather marked definition between shoulder and belly. Very long belly, tapering to a short, scarcely distinguishable toe. Clay:

Plate 4, number 3 illustrates the only stamp certainly attributable to this type: TD 4835, set at the base of the handle of the neck fragment on which it occurs, and consisting of the letters PAX.

The jars at Azaila occur in both the lower and the upper Iberian levels. See my comments above, under Type 4, on the Azaila chronology.

TYPE 6. Late second (?) and early first centuries B.C. Plate 2. This type is

represented by three whole jars and one neck, all at the Agora Excavations.

Two examples are stamped, on the rim. Illustrated is P 499, one of three identical jars from Section A, well at 14/15T, a jar mended from several fragments and entire except for the bottom of the toe. Preserved height, 0.849; diameter, 0.384. A stamp, ATTA (Plate 4, number 4), on rim above one handle. Rim very wide, vertical in profile, slightly thickened at top. Handles curved, short, wide; thick oval in section. Neck short; widens at top and at bottom. Shoulder not distinctly defined. Belly wide and egg-shaped, ending in a short, slender toe. Micaceous pale pinkish-buff clay with scattered reddish bits and a cream-colored surfacing. First published by V. Grace, Hesperia, III, (1934), p. 294 (stamp) and p. 295 (neck of jar).

TYPE 7. Late second century B.C. Plate 2. One jar certainly belonging to this type is known: Agora SS 9396, from Section Γ, layer 3 of Martyr I of Great Drain. Height, 0.92; diameter, 0.36. A whole jar, except for pieces missing from belly and restored in plaster. The same stamp, PASI (Plate 4, number 5), is set on both handles near the upper attachments. Rim narrow and flaring out very strongly from top to bottom; wide diameter. Handles of medium length; wide at top, tapering to narrow at bottom; oval to almost round in section. Neck long, widening at top and bottom. Sloping shoulder. Wide, egg-shaped belly. Long, slim, twisted toe. Micaceous tannish clay, with some large bits and sand; no surfacing.

TYPE 8. Late second and early first centuries B.C. (?) Plate 2. One certain example of this type is known: Delos TD 5953. Height, ; diameter, . A whole jar, rather small, and very light in weight. The same stamp, ADESLI (Plate 5, number 1), is set on both handles near the upper attachments. Rim narrow and vertical in profile; small diameter. Handles of medium length, medium to narrow in width, oval to round in section. Neck slim, widening at top

and bottom. Sloping shoulder. Wide, egg-shaped belly. Longish, slim toe. Finely micaceous pinkish-buff clay, with frequent red bits and a light surfacing.

TYPE 9. Late second (?) and early first centuries B.C. Plate 2 . One example of this type is known: Agora P 3862, from Section B', drain at 58/H. Height, 0.788; diameter, 0.332. Jar with rim and part of toe missing. Unstamped. Handles of medium width and length; oval to almost round in section; slightly ribbed and very close to neck. Neck nearly cylindrical, widening slightly at bottom and perhaps at top. Sharply defined shoulder. Belly almost rectangular in profile. Thick, apparently long toe. Micaceous dull dark-reddish clay; coarse; many small black and white bits. Cream-colored surfacing.

TYPE 10. Late second (?) and early first centuries B.C. Plate 2 . 149 examples of this type are known: 98, of which 67 are whole jars, at the Agora; 49, of which six are whole jars, at Delos; and two fragments at the National Museum in Athens. 123 of the examples of this type are stamped. Chosen for illustration are Agora SS 7367 and SS 11104, both from Section X, well at 65/N, the source of all but four of the examples of this type at the Agora. Both jars are entire, both are 0.855 in height, and they bear the same stamp, SPE, incuse, on the shoulder. (See Plate 5 , number 2 , for the stamp on SS 7367. SPE is the most frequent stamp on Roman amphoras in the East, 32 examples being known). SS 7367^("a" on the plate) is 0.35 in diameter. Rim vertical in profile with slight depression in center. Clay stopper sealed in place in mouth. Short handles, medium in width and squarish in profile; oval to almost round in section. Neck short, widening somewhat at top and bottom. Angle between shoulder and belly clearly defined. Egg-shaped belly. Slim, longish toe, rounded at base. Micaceous pinkish-buff clay with lighter surfacing. SS 11104^("s" on the plate) differs in the following respects: the diameter is 0.338; rim flares out from top to bottom;

handles are less squarish in profile; toe is conical and pointed. The 67 contemporary whole jars belonging to this type at the Agora show conclusively that, while the general proportions of a type remain constant, numerous variations are possible in the shapes of rims, handles, and other parts.

TYPE 11. Late second (?) and early first centuries B.C. Plate 3 . 362 examples (all fragmentary) of this type are known, making it by far the most frequently-occurring type of Roman amphora in the eastern Mediterranean area. 271 examples come from Alexandria (248 are in the collection of Mr. L. A. Benachi, 11 are known to be at the Alexandria Museum, and 12 are in the Rostovitch Collection, now housed in the National Museum at Athens); 63 have been found at Delos; and 28 are from Athens (13 at the Agora, 14 at the National Museum, and one at the Kerameikos Museum). A large number of additional representatives of this type is thought to be stored in the Alexandria Museum. All examples are stamped. The jar on Plate 3 is the only whole jar I have seen of this type, number 34 in the museum at Brindisi. Height, 0.78; diameter, 0.494. A whole jar, with a different stamp set on each handle: VEHILI on one, and GORGIA on the other (see below). Rim very wide and divided into three bands: a thickened one, convex in profile, at the top; a smaller, vertical one in the center; and a narrow, out-flaring one at the bottom. Handles very short, semi-circular in profile, and round in section; somewhat pinched at lower attachment. Neck short and widening toward bottom. Wide, broad shoulder, sloping into belly which is considerably wider at top than at bottom. Toe a convex button set off by groove from belly. Reddish clay. Surface covered with a lime (?) deposit.

The stamps on Plate 5 (numbers 3 and 4) are duplicates of the ones on the Brindisi jar: VEHILI (Delos TD 5096), the second most frequent Latin stamp in the East, 28 examples being known; and GORGIA (TD 1507).

Four amphoras apparently belonging to this type, but showing numerous

differences in details from the jar at Brindisi, are represented in the group of jars from Azaila (Cabré, op. cit., plate 60, 15-18). See my comments on Azaila under Type 4 above.

TYPE 12. Early first century B.C. (and perhaps earlier) to late first century A.D. (and perhaps later). Plate 3 . 23 examples of this type are known, all fragmentary: 19 in the Benachi Collection at Alexandria, three at the Agora, and one at Corinth. All are stamped. Illustrated is ^{Agora} SS 10072, from Section $\Pi\Pi$, house debris south of Roman house B, room 1. Preserved height, 0.28. Fragment of upper half of small jar, with rim and one handle entire, and pieces of neck, shoulder, and belly. Stamp, EVILVSORPHE [(Plate 5 , number 5), on shoulder at base of neck (although the handle is the usual location for stamps in this type). Narrow, rounded rim. Angular, double handle, arching up from upper attachment. Small, apparently cylindrical neck. Sharply defined, rather wide shoulder. The bellies of similar jars are narrow and rather ovoid. Micaceous pinkish clay with buff surfacing.

Double handles, the characteristic feature of this type, are of frequent occurrence on ancient amphoras. In the eastern Mediterranean, most amphoras with twin or double handles are unstamped or stamped in Greek, and there is some evidence that they came from the island of Cos. A Greek origin for the jars with Latin stamps is not so likely, even for those found in the East. Such jars are common in the West, bearing *dipinti* which name Italian wines and Roman consuls. Further notes on the origin of these Latin-stamped double-handled jars will be found in a later article. Some chronological evidence may be added here. Dressel's Types 2, 3, and 4 (CIL, XV) are related to this type of jar. Dressel's examples, all found in Rome, bear dates ranging from the late first century B.C. to the early first century A.D. Type 12 at Pompeii (CIL, IV), another double-handled jar, can be dated to the third quarter of the first century A.D. The

double handles with Latin stamps found in the older of the two walls of amphoras at Carthage may very probably be dated between 43 B.C. and 15 B.C. (R. P. Delattre, "Le mur à amphores de la colline Saint-Louis à Carthage," Bulletin archéologique du Comité des Travaux Historiques et Scientifiques, (1894), 89-119). Numerous examples of the type from Gaul and Germany (Loeschcke, op. cit., under Type 78) can not at present be so certainly dated, although Lamboglia would give a mid-second century B.C. date to unstamped jars of this class found in the sea at Pegli near Genoa (op. cit., Appendix, pp. 221-222).

Fairly definite dates are furnished by two handles in the Benachi Collection at Alexandria. One, numbered C 5 (Plate 5, number 6), bears two stamps, POST.CVRT and .DI. The former stamp, found throughout the West, and apparently always on double-handled jars, has been convincingly associated by Dessau with C. Rabirius Postumus, whom Cicero defended in 54 B.C., describing him as one "cuius res in pluribus provinciis versata est" (H. Dessau, "Gaius Rabirius Postumus," Hermes, XLVI, (1911), 613-620; XLVII, (1912), 320). Another stamp in the Benachi Collection, P.ARPINI, number C 11, is found also on jars of Type 11, and can therefore be dated as early as the early first century B.C. Most of the Latin-stamped jars of this type found in the East, however, probably postdate the Republican period; we should otherwise expect to find them represented at Delos, where so far the known examples are stamped only in Greek or are unstamped.

TYPE 13. Late first century B.C. to early first century A.D. Plate 3 . 20 representatives of this type are known to be at the four sites: 15 at the Agora, one at the National Museum in Athens, three at Delos, and one ^{in the Benachi Collection} at Alexandria. Except for a broken but reconstructed whole jar at the Agora, all examples of this type are fragmentary. All are stamped. Shown on Plate 3 ^{Agora} is/SS 9468, from Section EE, well at 49/IE. Height as restored, 0.87; diameter as restored, ca. 0.35. A jar with many fragments missing and restored in plaster. Two different, broken

stamps set on rim (see below). Rim wide, thickened at top, and sloping inward from top to bottom. Handles of medium length; widish; thick ovals in section. Neck widens at top and bottom but narrows just below upper attachments of handles. Slanting shoulder, joined to belly at an angle. Longish, wide belly. Large letter, "A", incised inverted on belly. Shape of toe uncertain. Micaceous pinkish-buff clay with some bits; yellowish surfacing.

The stamps illustrated, ARIE.H and KANI (Plate 5, numbers 7 and 8) are on SS 10718, a fragmentary jar of this type. These same stamps, or ones very close to them, are to be reconstructed on the rim of SS 9468.

TYPE 14. Late first century B.C. to early first century A.D. Plate 3 . 25 examples of this type are known, including 17 at the Agora, three at the National Museum in Athens, three at Corinth, one at Delos, and one ^{in the Benadi Collection} at Alexandria. Five nearly whole jars, all at the Agora, are known. All but three of the examples of this type are stamped. Illustrated is ^{Agnv} SS 6179, one of two jars of Type 14 from Section I, well at 2/17. Preserved height, 1.04; diameter, 0.41. Jar entire except for one handle and tip of toe. Stamp, apparently to be read HILAR[, on rim (Plate 6, number 1). Rim wide, sloping inward from top to bottom, very close to neck at bottom. Handles curved, very long, and widish; oval to almost round in section. Neck long, widening at top and bottom. Shoulder not sharply defined. Belly long, widening distinctly at bottom. Long toe. Micaceous pinkish-buff clay; no apparent surfacing.

Type 14 is the equivalent of Dressel's Type 6 (CIL, XV), of which many examples have been found in Italy and the West. On a jar of this type in Rome (CIL, XV, 4582) Dressel found a dipinto naming the consuls of 36 A.D. Jars of this sort have also been found in the older wall of amphoras at Carthage (cf. Delattre, op. cit.), to which a date between 43 and 15 B.C. has been given.

TYPE 15. Late first century B.C. and first century A.D. (?) Plate 3 . Ten

examples of this type are known: two whole jars and seven fragments of jars at the Agora, and one fragment at Corinth. Eight of the ten examples are stamped. Illustrated is ^{Agora} P 19380, from Section $\Pi\Pi$, below stosis V in Point Martyr on Great Drain Bridge. Height, ; diameter, 0.32. Jar entire except for bottom of toe. Unstamped. Rim wide, thickened at top, sloping in from top to bottom, and scarcely separated from neck; small diameter. Handles short; medium width to narrowish; round in section. Neck short, widening at bottom and just above handles. Sloping shoulder, scarcely distinguishable from belly. Belly long; wider at bottom than at top. Toe perhaps very long. Micaceous bright pinkish-buff clay with scattered dark bits and a cream-colored surfacing.

A handle-stamp, HERENNA or HERENNIA, occurs on seven of the ten examples of Type 15. One of these stamps (Agora SS 5885) is illustrated on Plate 6, (number 2).

TYPE 16. Late first century B.C. to early first century A.D. Plate 3. One example of this type is known, Agora SS 11012, from Section I, well in Street of Roman Agora. Preserved height, 0.38; diameter of rim, 0.145. A neck fragment, with one handle and part of rim preserved. Oval stamp, PRISCA (Plate 6, number 3), on rim. Rim wide and slanting inward from top to bottom; scarcely separated from neck. Handle long, close to neck, and round in section. Neck long and slim. Belly probably similar to those of Types 14 and 15. Pinkish-buff clay with cream surfacing.

TYPE 17. Mid-first century B.C. to first century A.D. (?) Plate 4. Six fragments belonging to jars of this type are known: four at Alexandria and ^(three in the Benachi Collection and one in the Alexandria Museum) two at Delos. Five of the six examples are stamped. Shown on Plate 4 is a fragmentary neck in the Benachi Collection in Alexandria (number P 20). Preserved height, 0.252; estimated diameter at shoulder, 0.33. Neck, with rim and one handle entire, and piece of shoulder. Unstamped. ^{* scratched on shoulder.} Rim divided into two

sections, the upper one overhanging the lower one and flaring out from top to bottom, and the lower one curving in and thickened at bottom. Handle short and curved, oval in section. Thick, short neck. Broad, sloping shoulder. Belly probably much wider at top than at bottom, like that of Type 11. Clay: vivid orange, purplish toward surface. Handles are purplish-buff.

The stamp illustrated, PCBSCV (Plate 6, number 4), is on a rim fragment of this type, also in the Benachi Collection (number P 31).

TYPE 18. Late first century B.C. and first century A.D. Plate 4. Five examples of this class, ^{all stamped,} are known: three fragments at the Agora, one at the National Museum in Athens, and one at Corinth. Illustrated is Agora SS 2475, from Section B, well at 25/M. Preserved height, 0.153; diameter of rim, 0.127. Neck entire, with fragments of shoulder. Stamp, T.V.P. (Plate 6, number 5), on one handle. Red line painted on handles and shoulder. Rim narrow, rounded, and jutting out from neck. Handles semi-circular in profile, sloping upward at upper attachment, wide, very thin in section, and ribbed so strongly that they resemble double handles. Short neck, widening at top and, especially, at bottom. Whole jars of this type have a broad, ovoid belly, wider at top than at bottom, and a short, thick toe, flattened at the bottom (reconstruction based on a jar at Meroë in the Sudan, number 21-3-375).

TYPE 19. Late first and early second centuries A.D. (?) No illustration of jar-type available. Four fragments of this type are known, all of them at the Agora. All are stamped. One stamp, LEV.GEN. (SS9264, from Section NN, area to north of Roman Bath), is illustrated on Plate 6 (number 6). In the photograph may be seen certain characteristics of the jar-type to which the fragment belongs. There is no separation of rim and handle. The handle widens at the upper attachment to form the rim. The stamp is placed at the point where rim and handle join. The rim (its upper surface occupies the left side of the photograph) is very narrow

and flares out sharply from top to bottom. Micaceous pale pinkish-buff clay with beige surfacing and small bits.

Numerous fragmentary examples of similar "handle-rims" are on display in the museum at Ostia. I have seen no whole jars of this type.

TYPE 20. Middle of the second century A.D. (to middle of the third century?). No illustration of jar-type available. 23 stamped fragments belonging to this type are known in the eastern Mediterranean: 18 at Alexandria (17 in the Benachi Collection and one in the Alexandria Museum), four at Athens (three at the Agora and one at the National Museum), and one at Corinth.

This class of amphoras corresponds to Dressel's Type 20 (CIL, XV), about which more is known, probably, than about any other type of Roman jar. These amphoras, most or all of which came from Spain (as Dressel discovered from the dipinti), have been found in large numbers throughout the Roman world, and especially at Monte Testaccio in Rome. No whole jars of this type have as yet been found at Alexandria, Athens, or Corinth. The fragments at those sites are all handles, which may be described as very thick and heavy, wide, semi-circular in profile, and irregularly circular in section. The clay is micaceous, sandy, coarse pinkish-buff. The stamps are generally set on the sides of the handles. The known whole jars of this class are characterized in addition by narrow rims, which are rounded in profile with sometimes a pointed rib at the center of the profile; short necks; globular bellies, and very small toes.

Illustrated on Plate 6 (number 7) is a handle from Corinth, CP 1838, stamped with the name T.A.ASIATICI.

TYPE 21. Late second and early third centuries A.D. Plate 7. Five fragmentary examples of this type of jar occur at the Agora. All are stamped. Illustrated is P 1515, from Section Z, 28/Θ. Preserved height, 0.245; diameter of rim, 0.11. Entire upper part of jar, including shoulder, is preserved.

Incuse stamp of two lines on neck: SAT./POS. (Plate 6 , number 8). Rim narrow, rounded in contour, and close to neck. Handles ear-shaped in profile, narrow, semi-circular in section. Neck short, widening at bottom. Whole jars of this type (several are in the museum at Ostia) have very long, almost cylindrical bellies. Micaceous, coarse dark grey to deep pinkish-buff clay with light surfacing. Very thin fabric.

TYPE 22. Third century A.D. (?) Plate 4 . One example of this type is known: Agora SS 11107, from Section A , well at 74/1. Height, 0.595; diameter, 0.33. Jar mended from many pieces; fragments of rim, one handle, shoulder, and belly missing and restored in plaster. Almost illegible stamp (Plate 6 , number 9) set on top of rim. Rim very narrow, sloping inward from top to bottom and not sharply separated from neck; flattened at top. Handles widish and ribbed; very thin in section; sloping up at upper attachment and very angular in profile. Short neck, widening at top and bottom. Shoulder not distinguished from belly. Belly nearly cylindrical. Short, flat toe. Micaceous, sandy yellow-buff clay with reddish bits.
